UPDATE

It's been a busy first few months for the TGB since our first meeting in May 2017. We have now held 6 meetings in total to help ensure that Green Ridge has had a successful opening and first term.

Part of this process has been ensuring that Green Ridge has all of the required policies in place to meet our statutory requirements and ensure that the school has the right processes to provide a safe, nurturing environment for all of its pupils. These policies have been reviewed the TGB and adopted, and are available on the school's website here.

We have overseen the move into the current building, which has gone smoothly, despite some snagging issues along the way. We continue to review the progress of the development of the permanent building in case any delays occur which may affect the school. At present, the build is going well and is on schedule.

As a governing body, one of our key roles is to monitor the school's financial viability. At Green Ridge, as a new school, one of the biggest challenges is ensuring that we continue to attract new pupils to help our school grow. The school will be advertising shortly and continuing to raise its profile to ensure that next year we have classes as full and lively as this year.

Green Ridge will also be opening a nursery next year as part of our plans to grow the school, and you will likely see and hear some advertisements for this shortly. We will continue to keep parents and guardians updated on the plans for the new nursery as they develop.

In addition to our regular meetings to discuss the school's progress, each of the Governors will be visiting Green Ridge every term to experience day-to-day life at the school, and to monitor our respective link areas. You can read more about Rachel and Gayle's visits over the page.

UPDATE

During its first year Green Ridge is overseen by the Transi-Governina tion Board (TGB); we are a small governing body appointed by REAch2 to help Green Ridge get up and running. To see who makes up the TGB, please see page 2.

GOVERNOR VISIT FROM RACHEL LEACH

One of the main reasons I decided to become a governor for Green Ridge Primary Academy is because it is a stone's throw away from my house. Living and working in the Berryfields Community I was excited to hear when a new school was going to open here, I contacted Mr Wanford to express my interest. This was back in January last year and I cannot believe how far we have come since then

During November I spent a day with Mr Wanford and his team seeing what exciting things they have put in place for the pupils. As I entered the building I could immediately see that the pupils' welfare and safety is at the heart of the school. As the link governor for safeguarding this was reassuring to see. Mr Wanford and I met to talk over safeguarding within the school and I was impressed at how rigorous the team were at making sure every child is safe looked and after within school. After our meeting I visited both Mrs Mackie (Willow) and Miss Holloway's (Birch) classes where pupils were focusing on their numeracy and writing skills for the afternoon. In Willow the pupils were learning about numbers, focusing on the number 9. Students were

challenged within this activity as they needed to show Mrs Mackie that they understood the number 9 by fetching 9 objects and completing 9 tasks such as jumping jacks. When I entered Miss Holloway's class they were focusing on writing skills. Children were writing out their names and addresses. this challenged pupils to tell Miss Holloway their full name with some saying they lived in Aylesbury or giving the street they lived on. If a pupil became stuck on how to spell their name Miss Holloway would sound out their surname using phonics. wouldn't just tell them but would make them listen to the sounds she was making so they could then figure out the letters to write down.

Mr Wanford and his team have shown they have the best interest of the pupils at heart. All staff create a positive culture and ethos within the school community, having safeguarding as an important

part of everyday school life. I am excited to see what the school does in the new year and I wish them all a restful and
