Enjoy your weekend.



Nursery Entrance

Nursery parents & carers will be pleased to know that the entry doors are now fully installed and working! Please press 2 followed by the call button to alert staff inside the nursery who can then release the door for you to enter. If you arriving for am or pm sessions you need to enter via the playground as usual, this is for access outside of these hours, for example breakfast/after school sessions. Please exit the building through these same doors as unaccompanied adults are not permitted to walk through the school building for safeguarding reasons.

School Entrance

Parents & carers who need access to the main school should <u>press 1 followed by the call button</u> to alert a member of staff to release the main door. May we remind parents that the office is open between 8:15am-4:00pm and collections from Busy Living after school club should be made directly from the external doors of the club via the rear playground. Many thanks for your cooperation with this.

Parking

We appreciate that parking around the school site is challenging at the moment, but could we ask that parents & carers respect our neighbours when choosing a place to leave their car. We have received phone calls regarding cars blocking access to homes and concerns about parking on the white zig-zag lines by the zebra crossing which makes crossing the road hazardous. Additionally, the disabled parking bays are for blue badge holders only and must not be obstructed or used by any other vehicles. We appreciate your assistance with keeping our school safe for pedestrians.
