#### Speak Out, Stay Safe Parent Workshop

Next week, children in Year One, Two and Three will be having workshops delivered by the NSPCC about how to keep themselves safe.

If you would like any more information about the NSPCC Speak out, Stay safe Programme, we are running a parent/carer information session which will include all the resources we are sharing with your children, including how you can support at home. This will be run on Tuesday, 6th November at 2.00pm in the hall. We would encourage as many parents/carers as possible to attend this extremely worthwhile session. You can also find some frequently asked NSPCC questions on the website nspcc.org.uk/schools or please come and speak to one of the staff about the programme.

The NSPCC's work in schools will help encourage conversations about staying safe – and they have a number of child-friendly materials to help you carry on the conversation afterwards. That includes 'The Underwear Rule', a simple way for parents to help keep children safe from sexual abuse – without using scary words or even mentioning sex.

Little Acorns are learning all about Nursery Rhymes this half term. The reading corner has been transformed into 'Little Miss Muffets Corner' and the children have enjoyed making spiders and reading stories on the toadstools but also learning the rhyme of Miss Muffet.



#### Reception



On Monday we introduced the new topic, 'Helping Hands' to the children. The children discussed who helps them with their talk partners and we came up with a mind map of different

people who help us! Many children

have been accessing our Fire Engine Reading Area, remembering to squirt 'water', in between reading, to any flames they may



have spotted! Our Role Play Area has also been transformed into a Hospital! There have been many doctors, nurses and surgeons in action, taking care of their patients. We have even observed some fantastic mark making through the children writing prescriptions, patient forms and taking notes from telephone messages. We look forward to a nurse visiting today to find out more!

#### Year One

Yesterday, Elm and Beech class spent some of their day outside as part of their celebration for Outdoor Classroom Day. The children were extremely excited and couldn't wait to enjoy the outdoors. To start, they all wrapped up warm and then drank some hot squash while they enjoyed the fresh air. Then they completed some Maths challenges around the playground, making shapes with certain items or counting the steps from one side of the playground to the other. The rain started, but they managed to get outside in between to complete more Maths activities and build on their relationships by working together in groups.
