This week has been a great opportunity for the children to openly discuss what bullying is (and is not) as part of our anti-bullying week focus. Through assemblies, class discussions and drama workshops, our children have been exploring the issue of bullying for both victims and perpetrators, and how bullying is never right. Our aim is to empower the children to tell an adult if they have a concern or worry. That being said, we have reminded all our children that bullying is not a one-off occurrence, accidentally getting hurt or feeling sad because you may not be playing with who you want to. Please help us to reinforce these messages at home.

It was lovely to see all the children coming into school this morning in their sea of yellow outfits and thank you for your donations towards Children in Need and the toy swap shop - more on this later in the newsletter. I was joined at the gate this morning by Gill Ellyard, the Regional Director for REAch2 who oversees the academies within our area. Anti-Bullying Week & Odd Sock Day

As part of Anti-Bullying Week, we joined many other schools across the country to hold an 'Odd Socks Day' on Monday to kick-start our week focussed on 'Choose Respect'. What was really interesting was how difficult some children (and adults!) found it to wear odd socks, having always worn matching pairs. We have had lots of lessons and activities this week to teach the children about equal opportunities and how bullying is not acceptable just because someone may be seen as 'different'.

We have positively reinforced to the children that bullying is not acceptable and never right. Please do ask your child what they have been learning about this week, and help us to teach the children that they need to ask for help if ever they experience any kind of bullying.

Parent/Carer Book-Look opportunity

Next Thursday after school, we are holding and open classroom event where parents/carers and family members are welcome to come into classes to have a look at their child's exercise books and learning so far this term. Classrooms will be open from 3.15-4.15pm and parent/carers can simply turn up at any point during this hour to their child's class, via the external classroom door. Your child's class teacher will be available, as well as your child's workbooks. This is an informal opportunity for you to see how your child is doing, look at your child's learning alongside them and ask any questions you may have to the class teacher.

We do ask however that if you require a specific meeting with your child's teacher which is not something general, that you ask to make a separate meeting for this.

Anti-Bullying workshops

Over the past week, the children have been learning about bullying. Within these sessions, the children have explored what bullying looks like, how to respond to it and who to talk to if you need support. They have also

took part in an anti-bullying workshop that took place today. The children warmed up with a few exercises, where they explored finding new partners



within their class. Next, they reflected on themselves and their own emotions and reactions. The session finished with the children learning how to be firm and confident when responding to bullies. I want to say a big thank you to Hannah and Perform for Schools who delivered the workshops.

Little Ridges Nursery

This week in Little Acorns we have been focusing on the nursery rhyme "Miss Polly Had A Dolly". We have even learnt all of the Makaton signs to go along with our rhyme. We have been using our imagination in our Doctor's role play area and making sure we are looking after the babies when they are poorly!



We have also been learning some new sounds this week and the rhymes to help us form them correctly. We have all had such a brilliant week growing our brains!

Little Berries have had a great week learning about public transport! We started the week by making different vehicles out of various shapes and reading



transport stories. All of the class were able to remember at least one mode of transport that we have discussed over the past weeks! We have also enjoyed making a large train out of building blocks and pretending we are off on an exciting adventure. We've made tickets, packed our bags and even had real credit cards to play with!

Again another fantastic week had by all of the children in Little Ridges, more exciting activities planned for next week....

Reception





This week, Birch and Willow class have continued to secure their 2D shape knowledge through a shape challenge with some string! The children worked together to create different shapes with the string, discussing the properties of each shape. The children also went on a shape hunt outside; there were many different shapes they could spot! For our topic, 'Helping Hands' we have discussed what police do and how they help us. The children have been great at applying their phonic knowledge to label police uniform. We

look forward to a Policeman visiting today to find out more!

Year One

This week Elm and Beech have been looking at addition in Maths. All of the children have been using part-part-whole models to understand number bonds, and using their mastery skills to write them in different ways by moving the equals sign or drawing a bar model. We then compared number bonds and tried to balance the



scales by making them equal, for example, we had 4 + 3 on one side and we could have had 5 + 2 on the other! Elm and Beech have also been using speaking frames to explain their reasoning in all of their lessons this week, such as 'I know this because' or 'I worked out ____ so ____'.

Year Two




As part of our Science lessons we have been looking at different materials and their properties. This week (at the children's request) we have been making slime to test its elasticity. As predicted, it was incredibly flexible and we discovered that when stretched it becomes translucent!

Year Three

This week in Cedar Class, we finished our first class novel of the year. The children REALLY enjoyed listening to Who Let the Gods Out by Maz Evans and following Elliot on his mission to save his home, help his mother and defeat Thanatos, King of the Demons. Many of the children asked for information on the sequel to Who Let the Gods Out as they wanted to continue the series. The next book is called Simply

the Quest and continues Elliot's adventure to find the Earth Stones and defeat Thanatos. It was lovely to see the children enjoying and engaging in the story so we voted as a class for our next novel. The children chose The Christmasaurus by Tom Fletcher: a brilliant book with hilarity, heart and a whole lot of Christmas!
