Non-Uniform Day

Parent Drop Off Arrangements – Class doors

Now that all children have settled into the new school routines, we ask that you no longer accompany your child into the classroom each morning – particularly for those children in YR and Y1. Instead, it would support us and your child's independence to wait just outside the door, under the canopy, or even letting them walk in by themselves once in the wooden fenced area by the Y1 classrooms. In the same way, if your child has forgotten something at the end of the day can you ask them to come back independently to collect what they need rather than an adult coming in with them. A huge part of our role in Early Years and Key Stage 1 is fostering independence and this change will greatly help with the progress the children make in this area. There will, of course, be members of staff on hand within the classrooms to help the children locate things or to provide distraction if they need it. If you do need to catch us at the start or end of the day, then this is absolutely fine but we may ask you to wait until the initial rush of children arriving/leaving is over.

Please note as well if you do need to catch the Class Teacher for an urgent message in the morning, you may not be able to do this the closer it gets to 8.50am when doors shut. Staff have a responsibility to keep our children safe and start their daily learning – they are unable to leave a class unattended in order to have a conversation. If you do need to speak to someone then please ensure you arrive in sufficient time, or alternatively pass your message on through the school office.

The children spent the afternoon in their House teams, learning more about why their house has been given its name, creating their new flag/emblem (which will be then used as a symbol throughout the school).

Attendance

We are aware that some children have been affected by Chicken Pox over the last few weeks, and there is a rise in the number of children with colds and flu like symptoms. Now that almost all children have had their flu immunisation, we hope that the instances of these will be heavily reduced. We continually ask children to wash their hands every time they go to the toilet to develop good personal hygiene, and we would be grateful if you could continue to reinforce these messages at home.

Our attendance as a school is currently 97%, meeting our own target of 97%, which is fantastic! Please continue to work with us to ensure that this good level of attendance continues across the school next half-term.

Any child who has irregular attendance (including children who are persistently late and those with less than 95% attendance) are monitored closely by the school and the Local Authority. The academy will contact individual families where there is irregular school attendance in order to support them to ensure their child is at school regularly. Attendance is so important for our children and their learning, so that

they can make progress. One day really can make a difference to a child, so please help us to ensure that they are at school. The academy will notify you should your child's attendance drop below 95%, and may request a meeting with parents/carers and the Local Authority and Governing Body in order to work with you to improve your child's attendance so that it is at least 97% or better

Volunteer Readers

We are now beginning to think about further building our bank of volunteers who come in to support us during school time with a range of activities, including listening to children read, helping with displays, preparing resources etc. The list is endless in schools!

Anyone wishing to become a regular volunteer (e.g. coming into school once a week, or more than four times in a 30-day period) should complete a Volunteer Application Form, which is available from the school office, and the Volunteer Agreement which sets out the school's expectations of its volunteers and confirms that they have received a copy of this Agreement. We will then contact you to arrange how we can best utilise your support and time. Volunteers will likely need to undergo a Disclosure and Barring Check (DBS) to ensure the safeguarding of all our pupils. This will need to be completed and verified before volunteering can begin. There is also a requirement for all volunteers to have a safeguarding training session before you are able to work with the children individually.

Volunteers will be asked to support in classes/areas of the school where there is the most need for support. Parent volunteers who support on a regular basis should be aware that our school policy is that parents/carers do not work/support in their child's class or with their own child, as for some children this can be distracting and can place the class teacher in a difficult situation.

Volunteers do not have to stay for a full morning or afternoon session, even an hour would be appreciated but we do prefer for volunteers to attend on a regular basis to ensure continuity and aid planning.

If you have recently picked up an application from the office, please come in to collect the relevant paperwork. Thank you.

Reception


This week, in Willow and Birch class, we had different sized dinosaurs to measure. Our challenge was to put them in height order and begin to use the key vocabulary, 'tall' and 'short', to compare the heights. The children also measured the dinosaurs using cubes and it was fantastic to see the children applying the



knowledge they had learnt from the last two weeks! Many children were able to explain that the taller dinosaurs were measured using 'more' cubes and the shorter dinosaurs were measured using 'less' cubes. We have also been extremely impressed seeing the children begin to apply their phonic knowledge in their writing; we are looking forward to seeing them continue to progress after half term!

Year One

Elm and Beech have been editing and improving their work in English this week. They have practised editing some sentences that needed improving using their green editing



pencils, and then they edited and improved their innovated stories from last week about Duffy Driver. Elm and Beech know that they use their green pencils for



reading through and editing their work independently, and they use blue pencil to respond to teacher's feedback. It's great fun sending our sentences to the sentence doctor to get diagnosed, sometimes she prescribes some capital letters and full stops, and sometimes an injection of adjectives!

The effort that went into the designing and creating of our 17th century houses was amazing, and they are a great representation of how houses looked before The Great Fire of London.
