This month, schools across the country are marking LGBT month. The overall aim of LGBT History month


is to promote equality and diversity for the benefit of everyone. In particular, our aim has been to raise awareness of those people who might identify as LGBT, and also increase visibility of LGBT people, their history, lives and experiences.





Naturally, we have ageappropriate conversations and learning for children across the academy, but one common thread we have is the motto of 'different family, same love'. We recognise that children are brought up in families where there may not always be a stereotypical 'mum and dad', and some children might have two mums and two dads, for

example. We have been reading a range of ageappropriate texts with the children to reinforce these messages, and please do speak to your child's class teacher if you would like some more information.





#### Chinese New Year

Miss. Gardiner and Miss. Imbriano led an assembly on Monday about Chinese New Year which begun on Tuesday, with this, the year of the pig. Children learned about some of the Chinese traditions for New Year and



how these compared to those children may have experienced themselves at New Year after Christmas.

#### Safer Internet Day

Throughout the week, children have been focussing on how to keep themselves safe online as part of Safer Internet Day on Tuesday. In their special assembly led by e-Safety adviser, Richard Maskery, children were told about the age restrictions on particular apps, games and online software. Staff were surprised to see just how many children used or had access to some of the apps and software which was well beyond the age ratings given. We asked the children to not use, or even better – delete, apps such as Instagram or Snapchat if they had them on a personal



device of their own, because they were unsafe for children to use. For those children in Year Three, we discussed how these apps can give away your exact location, meaning that anyone could find you if you were talking online.



As a reminder for all parents and carers, should children disclose or report that they accessing games, videos or apps which are inappropriate for their age, our

academy has a duty to safeguard all children and one of the staff will talk to you about how we can support you to reduce the risks of your children using these until they are the correct age.

Children have been reminded that they should always have an adult around them if using the internet, and that they should always tell an adult if they get that 'butterfly' feeling that something isn't right. We have encouraged the children to tell an adult, and that an adult will not be angry to take your device away if something is wrong, but instead try and help you so that you stay safe and it doesn't happen again.

Overall, we tried to reinforce to the children the internet is a great thing, but we have to use it safely and know what to do if something goes wrong. #### Little Ridges Nursery



This week in Little Berries, we have continued our focus on jungle animals; focusing on a 'tiger' this week; and learning the Makaton sign to accompany it. noodles as well as fun food tasting with lots of traditional foods. Also, a huge thank you to those parents that came to our 'Marvellous Maths' stay and play session, it was lovely to see you all and Little Berries enjoyed showing off our maths skills all morning. Well done everyone, another fantastic week!



This week Little Acorns have been busy growing their brains learning lots of facts about Velociraptors. We would like to thank everyone who attended our Marvellous Maths stay and play on Wednesday. We enjoyed showing you how we start our day, and how we incorporate maths into our learning. We have been very

lucky to finally have our sandpit up and running for us to start using this week, and we have had lots of fun exploring in it. We have still been continuing learning our talk for writing story "How Do Dinosaurs Say Goodnight" and we will be finishing it next week. This week we also made a trip to our school library, which we all really enjoyed and are hoping to do it more often.

#### Reception



Willow and Birch class have continued to apply their phonic knowledge through writing letters back to the Evil Peas! On Thursday we got a surprise when we found cucumbers in Birch class and carrots in Willow class both trapped in ice! There were some great discussions about how to rescue the vegetables including, turning the

temperature up in the classroom, putting the ice in the sun, placing it near a light and even putting it in the oven! The children in Reception have continued to develop their subtraction skills and we have been impressed by how well they have picked this up.

#### Year One



This week Beech and Elm have been learning about why Neil Armstrong was a significant individual and how walking on the moon was an important event in our history. We came up with ideas after discussing in groups and watched some videos about how it has impacted our lives now. Beech and Elm then worked hard to

write a paragraph explaining why they thought he was a significant individual. They worked really hard to make sure they spelt their words correctly and kept their writing neat with finger spaces, capital letters and full stops!

#### Year Two



Throughout Maths this week Oak class have been looking at statistics. We began by collecting data and putting it into a tally chart, before converting our findings into a pictogram. We then began to compare the data to see which was the most and least popular, as well as the differences between them. Here is Anisa's

#### Year Three

We are now 5 weeks into Cedar Classes swimming and there are already signs of progress in all of the children. One group have been learning how to float effectively which is an



important live saving skill. Another group have been learning how to move efficiently by kicking their legs correctly. The final group have been learning how to breath underwater without upsetting their noses. It is a delight to see the excitement the children have on a Tuesday morning!
