A note from the Headteacher

Spring is here! I hope that everyone enjoyed the half-term break and has come back ready for another action-packed half-term. The weather was certainly kind to us over the break and we were lucky enough for this to continue to up to Wednesday this week at least! Just a polite reminder that our summer uniform does not come into effect until the summer term (after Easter) so we ask that shorts/summer dresses are not worn until then. Children should still be bringing their coats as normal each day, as the weather temperature as dropped again and they do need them at break and lunchtime when outside for longer periods. A number of children have also been without their PE kits this week so please ensure your child has the correct kit in school for their PE days.

You will have seen my letter yesterday about the Momo challenge and I just wanted to re-iterate the sensitivity around this subject area, given the mixed messages from the media. It is important that our children learn to use the devices they have safely and supervised; please do just be vigilant about what your child is accessing and encourage them to talk to you if they feel worried or unsure. Sometimes taking devices away only creates further distrust but letting them use them supervised, is far more supportive. If you do have any questions or are not sure to what to say to your child, please do just come and ask one of the staff.



What have we been learning?

Little Ridges Nursery



This week Little Berries have started a new topic, learning all about the farm! We have focused on the different animals and their young, seeing if we can name some of the babies. Also, our farm shop opened this week; we have been taking it in turns to be the shop keeper, buying and selling our farm produce. We also really

enjoyed the sunny weather we had at the beginning of the week, playing outside in the sand and water and making ice cream cupcakes with Miss Hussain. Starting a new term off with a bang, well done Little Berries.





This week Little Acorns were really excited to come back and discover a farm shop in the classroom. We have been selling and buying the fruits and vegetables to each other using the play money and looking closely at the weighing scales to see how heavy the fruit and vegetables are. As our new theme this term is 'Down on the farm' we will be learning a new farm animal each week. This week we have been focusing on a cow. We have learnt lots of interesting facts about how they produce their milk, what type of animal they are and what their young is called. Little Acorns are now looking forward to seeing the farm coming out to visit us on Wednesday and can't wait to see all of the different types animals and grow our brains further. We have made the most of the nice weather earlier this week by spending lots of time outside. We have been building on our motor skills by writing on the Perspex board building. As always, we have continued developing our phonics knowledge by recapping and learning a few new sounds.

Reception





Monday, introduced the new topic: 'Turrets and Tiaras' to Willow and Birch class. The children did well to discuss what they would like to find out, thinking of questions to ask. They showed great curiosity about the topic and even decided what they would like in their castle role play area! The children have designed, painted and created the castle, including making their own crowns. In Maths, we have introduced 3D shape; the children have been encouraged to identify 3D shapes in the classroom environment. They have even used 3D shapes to create their own castles for the Maths challenge! look forward to visiting Windsor castle

week to learn more about our topic!


Year One



Elm and Beech have been learning to count in 2s, 5s and 10s this week. They have been using number squares and colouring them in to help them count in steps, forwards and

backwards. They have then been applying this learning to different contexts, for example, filling in number tracks, using pictures to count in 2s, 5s and 10s and using problem solving skills to answer word problems. There has been a focus this week on reasoning skills also and the children have been writing why they know something and using their mathematical reasoning to back up their opinions. Lots of yellow learning dots have been given out!

Year Two



This week Oak class began learning about the life of Florence Nightingale and her influences on nursing today. We researched her early life and discovered what a strong and resilient lady she was. In theme, we wrote letters as if we were Florence during her time in Turkey, writing to ask for more

medical supplies for her hospital.

Year Three



As you know, this term Cedar Class are continuing with their Romans theme. After consideration, Miss Chalmers has made a change to the D&T project that

the children will undertake at the end of this half term. Instead of designing and making Roman shields, the children will be researching, designing, making and testing Roman catapults. 
