A note from the Headteacher

It's been a busy week at Green Ridge this week, and it has been wonderful that the sun is shining, at long last! Our week got off to a terrific start on Monday when we had the great pleasure of having Mr Vanags, from Humanists UK, lead our school assembly. He talked to the children about his own belief systems, including the golden rule of 'treating others as one would expect to be treated'. This was further explained through David McKee's Two Monsters book. We hope this opportunity allowed the children to experience another belief system, with the aim of the children understanding other people's points of view as they form their own values. What have we been learning?

Little Ridges Nursery

This week Little Berries have had an exciting new visitor, in the form of a stick insect! We were extremely interested in watching it move and talked about how small and delicate it was. We have put in a plant so it can eat and we continue to monitor them, to see if anymore eggs hatch to keep this one company. Following on our mini



beast theme, we also had a look at Little Acorns butterflies before they were set free. We talked about the life cycle of a butterfly and watched a video on it. We discussed the different patterns on their wings



and even made our own symmetrical butterfly painting. We would like to say thank you to all our parents that came for our stay and play session, it was lovely to see so many faces.

Next week is our Global Diversity Week, and we will be doing lots of art work, food tasting and discussions on our country, see

if your Little Berry can tell you what country we're learning about? Another great week everyone, well done!

This week our caterpillar chrysalises have continued to harden, and we have been patiently waiting for the butterflies to



arrive. Luckily, we haven't had to wait too long as they hatched on Tuesday morning! Little Acorns have been very excited to release them but we all discussed how important it was for them to strengthen up their wings before we could set them free! Finally, during our stay and play session, on Thursday morning, we let them go. This was such a lovely experience for Little Acorns to encounter as they used their courage to hold the butterflies before they flew off into the sky. Our insect focus this week has been ants. Little Acorns have loved learning some new facts and were all so surprised at how strong they are.

Due to the fantastic weather this week we have spent most of our time learning outside. We have particularly enjoyed being in our water tray outside, filling and emptying containers with some bubbly water. Building our fine motor skills by drawing and writing our sounds on the perspex board, hula hooping and throwing the bean bags at targets. What a busy week we have had!





Reception

This week, Willow and Birch class have been improving their writing skills with a challenge to write a letter to Jack to thank him for our magic beans and ask him some questions! The children are becoming so much more independent with their writing. We have been impressed with the

children applying their phonic knowledge, writing phonetically plausible sentences. Please continue to encourage this independent writing at home! In Maths this week, the children have continued to learn about the value of coins and have found the total of the coins in our purses by applying our addition skills.

Year One

This Wednesday, Year One took part in one of their 11B411 experiences and they rode a large animal – a horse! Flm and Beech went to Horsewyse and had a day full of activities that involved the ponies and horses on the farm. They made hay bales to feed the horses, groomed them by brushing and combing them and they all rode



one of the beautiful horses there. They learnt how to get on and off a horse safely and they enjoyed walking them around. 'Pumpkin' pulled them around on a cart so they could see the entire farm, and they even got to see some lambs and jump in some puddles! It was great that so many of them overcame their fears to take part, whether it was just for a few minutes or longer, we are proud of them all.



Year Two

This week Oak class completed the last of our KS1 SATs. Despite our timetable being very different these past two weeks, the children have taken all in their stride, showed endurance and worked incredibly hard. A big thankyou too, to all of our parents and families who have



also been showing so much support at home. In our theme lessons this week, we had the exciting opportunity to write letters to a school in the Isle of Coll that we have been learning about in our Geography. With a total population of around 200 people, the Sottish isle is very different to our home town of Aylesbury, so Oak class were armed with lots of fantastic questions to ask them! We look forward to them hopefully writing back to us!

Year Three

To link with our theme this term of The Great British Road Trip, Cedar Class went on a digital hike to find out about the three highest points in the UK; Mount Snowdon, Skafell Pike and Ben Nevis. First, we looked at a map and discussed how the height of the land is colour coded to show the change in landscape. The children quickly identified that Scotland has the largest area of land over 1000m above sea level. We also discussed how land in the middle of our island can be below sea level without being under water. Finally, the children used their internet detective skills to find out key information such as the location and height of the three peaks. The children also found out some interesting facts about each peak. Perhaps they can tell you what they learned at home!
