#### Little Ridges Nursery

#### Reception



#### Year One



#### Year Three

## News items from this week

#### **School Lunches**

May we politely remind parents & carers of KS2 pupils (years 3 & 4) that payment for school lunches should be made in advance. Please put a credit balance on your Arbor account that meals can be deducted from when taken. Thank you for your cooperation with this as the school is not able to give credit under any circumstances.

#### Lockdown Drills

The safety and welfare of our students and staff are our highest priority at Green Ridge. We practice safety drills throughout the year to help our children know what to do in an emergency. We have already conducted two fire evacuations which were very successful, and children now understand what to do if they hear an alarm and how to exit the building quickly and safely.

This morning and next Thursday afternoon we will be conducting a lockdown drill. A 'lockdown' procedure may be activated in response to any number of situations at the academy, but some of the more typical might be:

- A reported incident/civil disturbance in the local community (with the potential to pose a risk to staff and children in the academy)
- An intruder on the school site (with the potential to pose a risk to staff and children)
- A warning being received regarding a risk locally, of air pollution (smoke plume, gas cloud etc.)
- A major fire in the vicinity of the school

The goals of the drills are to improve our ability to protect children, save lives, and reduce injuries. These practice drills allow us to evaluate our emergency operation plans and improve our response skills. Whilst we would not ordinarily notify you about such drills, as this is the first one your child may have experienced we wanted you to be aware. You would only be notified if there were a real emergency.

The academy will conduct one lockdown drill each term. In this type of drill, we will secure the school building and safely shelter all children, staff and visitors inside the building. The purpose of this drill is to keep the children safe from any danger outside or inside the building. During a lockdown drill, all of the perimeter doors to the school building will be locked and will remain locked until the danger or issue outside or inside the building is removed. To enable everyone to remain safe, no one will be allowed to enter the building or leave the building until a member of the senior leadership team authorises such a release.

If you have any questions or need further information, please do not hesitate to call the main office.

#### Parent Forum Meeting

Mr. Wanford met with the class reps on Monday for the first Parent Forum meeting for 2019/20. A copy of the minutes can be found on our website here.

Please remember that we have a drop box in our lobby area by the main entrance should you have any ideas or feedback that you would like the Parent Forum to discuss.

As part of the Parent Forum discussion, we agreed to set up a survey monkey questionnaire for any ideas/suggestions which parents/carers may not be able to otherwise communicate to the school about. The link to the anonymous survey is here, and will remain 'open' to complete if and when you have any thoughts and ideas; however, please note that the responses are not monitored daily, and if your feedback or suggestion relates to an individual pupil or requires a response, please communicate to the school through the normal channels of your child's class teacher or the school office. #### Disabled Parking

Can we please remind parents/carers that the designated disabled parking bays at the front of the school and the rear of the car park, are for **Blue Badge holders only**. We have a number of families who require the use of these bays and it is not acceptable to park in them at any time unless you have a Blue Badge.

Unfortunately, we see a huge increase in cars when it is raining, but it does not make it acceptable to park in the designated disabled parking bays, around the edge of the carpark or in front of the gates at the rear of the car park.

Due to this, can we please encourage you to walk/ride/scoot to school where possible. Thank you for your understanding and support with this.

#### Medical Appointments

Please remember to inform Mrs. Cavanagh of any medical appointments that your child may have as early as possible. Please also provide us with an appointment card or letter.

Please do not collect/return your child earlier/later than necessary as we do not want them to miss out on important learning time.

The deadline for ordering a school lunch is 9.30am, so if your child has a medical appointment early in the morning and will not be in for morning registration, please contact the school office before 9.30am to let us know what your child would like to order if you do not provide a packed lunch.
