What have we been learning?

Little Ridges Nursery

This week we have been exploring pumpkins, decorating them with glitter and investigating shapes whilst carving it. We did a shape hunt around the classroom which we really enjoyed. We've also been exploring spiced playdoh and lots of spooky activities. Our Makaton signs this week were 'please' and 'thankyou'. There has been lots of mark making with Lego and car painting and the children have been getting more involved in Helicopter stories, well done Little Berries! We also made pumpkin spiced biscuitshope you enjoyed them!

Some fantastic learning happening this week in Little Acorns. Firstly we have been getting into the Halloween theme, by trying to free the spiders from the spaghetti using the tweezers. We have also been craving pumpkins and looking at their 'gooey' insides. Little Acorns have been getting creative by painting

some hedgehogs with forms to create their spikes. We have also been creating some fireworks with the kitchen towel tubes and glitter. Little Acorns have also been discussing Diwali, what it means and what's happens during this time. Reception

This week, Willow and Birch have continued to learn the story, 'Dinosaurs Love Underpants' through Talk4Writing. We have looked at different dinosaur names in detail, including discussing why a triceratops is called a triceratops! In Maths, the children have been finding 'one less' using different resources to support them.



Throughout the week, the children have used different senses to explore different things in the 'tuff' spot including jelly, ice and pumpkins. They have talked about what it feels and smells like too!

News items from this week

Pupil Learning Reviews

Thank you to all of our parents and carers who came along to these meetings on Monday and Wednesday evening. It was wonderful to see so many of you here to talk to your child's teacher and see all that your child has been learning to do this half-term and hear how well they have settled into their new classes.

Thank you as well to all those parents/carers who gave us a few minutes of their time to provide us with some valuable feedback about the academy. The survey is completely anonymous (unless you give your details to us when completing the survey in the comments), and we hope that you will be able to give us a picture of what parent/carer views are, and how we can continue to improve based on this.

Attendance

Now that the colder weather has descended, there are a number of children with colds and flu like symptoms. Now that almost all children have had their flu immunisation, we hope that the instances of these will be heavily reduced. We continually ask children to wash their hands every time they go to the toilet to develop good personal hygiene, and we would be grateful if you could continue to reinforce these messages at home.

Our attendance as a school is currently 97.4%, in-line with our own target of 97%, which is fantastic! Please continue to work with us to ensure that this good level of attendance continues across the school next half-term

Any child who has irregular attendance (including children who are persistently late and those with less than 95% attendance) are monitored closely by the school and the Local Authority. The academy will contact individual families where there is irregular school attendance to support them to ensure their child is at school regularly. Attendance is so important for our children and their learning, so that they can make progress. One day really can make a difference to a child, so please help us to ensure that they are at school. The academy will notify you should your child's attendance drop below 95% and may request a meeting with parents/carers and the Local Authority and Governing Body in order to work with you to improve your child's attendance so that it is at least 97% or better.

Parents/carers should note that if attendance drops significantly below the minimum 95% requirement, the

academy may not authorise any absences without medical evidence, and as such parents/carers could receive fixed penalty notices for irregular school attendance without good reason for absence.

Lockdown Drill

We are pleased to inform you that our practice lockdown drills went extremely well last week and yesterday. Our children remained calm, listened to the adults and knew exactly what they needed to do when the alert was given. Most importantly, our children understood the reason for doing this and know how to keep themselves safe should the need ever arise. We will continue to do these practices each term to ensure all staff and children are familiar with the procedures, in the anticipation that we never have to put them into practice for real.

Parent Forum Meeting

Mr. Wanford met with the class reps last week for the first Parent Forum meeting for 2019/20. A copy of the minutes can be found on our website here.

As part of the Parent Forum discussion, we agreed to set up a survey monkey questionnaire for any ideas/suggestions which parents/carers may not be able to otherwise communicate to the school about.
