### A note from the Headteacher



Elm class have been busy baking and cooking this week. Ruby helped make spaghetti bolognese and Darcie made scones. Yummy!





Orla from Elm class created an incredible maths video where she accurately measured the length of her sofa and a garden bench in cm using a tape measure. She then presented the work


Izzy from Beech class has been busy learning the time this week and Sreejan did some brilliant writing about the beach.






#### Year Two

#### School Travel Plan

#### Parent Forum

Yesterday afternoon Mr. Wanford and some of the leadership team met with the Parent Forum group online for a virtual meeting. It was a useful opportunity to hear how things are going from a parent/carer perspective and anything else we needed to consider whilst in this situation with home learning and any practical arrangements for when we return to school.

#### White Rose Maths Online Resources

The White Rose Maths home learning website is one of the online resources which the school has promoted for pupil use during this period. We use this scheme to support our delivery of Maths in school and they use similar techniques in their online videos as we do in our lessons. Alongside their videos, they have been releasing free worksheets for pupils to practise the skills learnt in the video. Unfortunately, from next week, the worksheets will no longer be available to those without a premium subscription and as a school we do not currently have this. However, we would like to continue encouraging pupils to use the free videos which they post. Additional free activities linked to the videos can also be found on the BBC Bitesize website. The activities found on BBC Bitesize will still link to the White Rose videos as the two organisations are working together to deliver online home learning.
