A note from the Headteacher

As we head into the penultimate week or so of the academic year, there is still so much for us to clarify and work through as we prepare for September and the wider opening of the school. I know many of you have questions about what is going to happen, and I just want to reassure you of where we are. Over the last week or so I have been putting together various risk assessments, systems and procedures in-light of the government guidance for schools to fully re-open in September. All our risk assessments and processes are having a final sign-off by REAch2 at the start of next week and following the anticipated 'green light' on these, we will then share with you our detailed plans for the new academic year. We are very much hoping to get as 'back to normal' as we can, within the parameters we have been given, but please be assured that we intend that all children return fully, full-time.

Just a reminder to all that our term finishes on Tuesday, 21st July as previously communicated in our term dates for this academic year. I know some parents/carers have heard that other schools are closing early for a range of reasons, but we consider it important to finish our term as we planned and give the children as much opportunity as they can to continue their learning before we finish again for six weeks. 
Reception


Year Three

Hrishi and Maia found different shapes and described Leon was awarded with this week's achievement certificate for his wonderful creative writing using a broad range of vocabulary throughout.






Year Four

Sign-up Sheet for Nursery, Reception and Year One and Childcare Sign-up for children of critical workers & vulnerable children – w/c Monday, 20th July

The sign-up sheet for children in Nursery, Reception, Year One and for the children of critical workers and vulnerable children is now open and will remain open until 12.00pm on Wednesday, 15th July. After this time, no further children will be admitted for the following week. Please follow this <u>link</u>.

For those pupils in Nursery, Reception and Year One, even if they are returning next week and signed up, they will still need to be signed up the following week so we know to expect them.

The childcare facility for children of critical workers and vulnerable children will continue to operate w/c 20th July for pupils in Year Two, Three and Four. Similarly, you are still required to sign-up via the link above.

End of term gifts/presents

We have been a few questions about whether we can accept end of terms gifts for staff with the COVID19 situation. Firstly, please know that we do not expect gifts or cards from parents/carers as a thank you; your gratitude in your kind words and e-mails and parent feedback is more than enough to show us your appreciation. However, if you do wish to pass something on to a member of staff at the end of term, we will have a box upon drop-off/pick-up on the last day of term where anything can be placed which will then be isolated before staff are allowed to access. We know this might appear extreme, but our advice is still to limit the contact of items taken to and from school. and so by isolating anything brought in initially, this reduces the risk of spreading any infection, should it be present. Thank you for your understanding with this.

School Lunches

If your child has specific medical dietary requirements, is Halal or has religious dietary requirements, Herts Catering Limited (HCL) require you to inform them by using this <u>link</u>.

Although you may have already made us aware, it is important that you share this information with HCL to ensure that they have all the relevant information required and to provide special diet menus if necessary.

Special diet menus will only be considered where evidence can be provided from a medical professional, such as a GP, hospital consultant or registered dietitian. Their nutritionist will then be able to review the information and where appropriate, create a suitable menu.

Due to Coronavirus, government guidelines require us to strictly limit the number of people in our store at any one time. Therefore in order to avoid people having to queue for hours outside, we are handling things differently this year. Please see as follows.

This year it's vitally important that you do NOT leave buying the uniform you need until the last minute.

If your child is starting school in September, we recommend booking a personal shopping appointment for fitting advice. We can assist you by visually judging which sizes your child will need. This is important because due to the guidelines our changing rooms are closed and your child will not be able to try items on in the store.

Also, we must ask that only one adult accompanies each child who needs uniform and that where possible customers wear a face covering.

Wherever possible parents/carers of existing students should order online, preferably selecting 'Click & Collect'. This will save you the cost of postage and avoid the risk of items getting lost in the post.

If you need to exchange any uniform bought online that's the wrong size, you must please return it within 14 days. All exchanged items will be quarantined for 72 hours.
