Messiah	A leader regarded as the saviour of a particular country, group, or cause.
Parable	A simple story used to illustrate a moral or spiritual lesson, as told by Jesus in the Gospels.
Pharisees	A member of an ancient Jewish sect, distinguished by strict observance of the traditional and written law, and commonly held to have pretensions to superior sanctity.
Analogy	A comparison between one thing and another, typically for the purpose of explanation or clarification.
Exodus	A mass departure of people.

- The Parable of the Lost Sheep
   Jesus was spending a lot of time talking to a tax collector and
- sinners. Many people, including the Pharisees, did not understand this so Jesus told them The Parable of the Lost Sheep.
- "Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one of them. Doesn't he leave the other ninety-nine in the open countryside and go and look for the lost sheep until he finds it? And when he finds it, he joyfully puts it on his shoulders and goes home. Then he calls his friends and neiahbours together and says, 'Rejoice with me! I have found my lost sheep!' I tell you that in the same way there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who do not need to repent."

- The Story of John the Baptist
- During the rule of King Herod of Judea, there lived a priest Zechariah and his wife Elizabeth. They were old and had always wished for a child.
- An angel of the lord appeared to Zechariah and told him his wife would be having a baby and that they should call him John.
- Zechariah did not believe the angel, so his voice was taken away as punishment.
- Elizabeth had the child and named him John.
- John grew up to be a man of strong character and started baptising people in the River Jordan.
- When Jesus was ready to start his public mission, he went to John at the River Jordan and asked him to baptise him.
- When Jesus was baptised he saw the Holy Spirit come down from heaven and John realised he had baptised the messiah.
