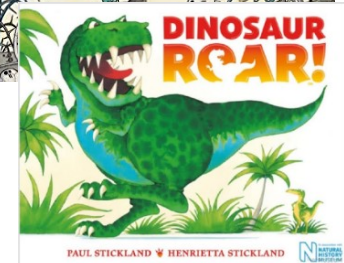
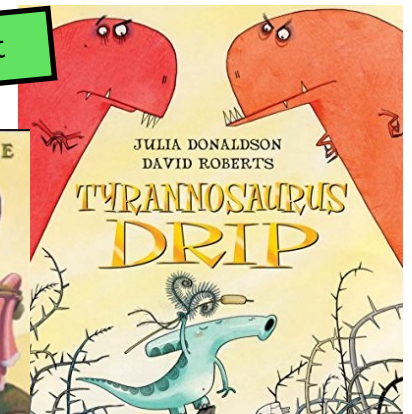
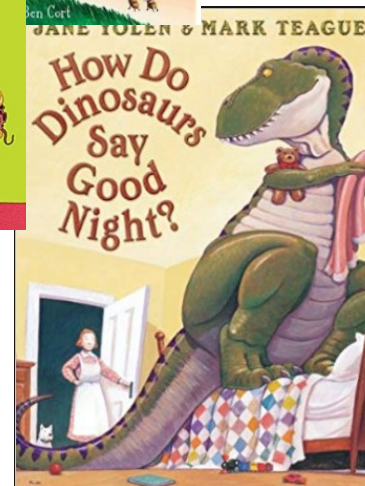
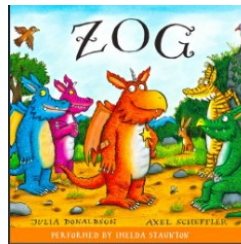
Term	Definition
 Stegosaurus	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Herbivore • Poor eye sight but good sense of smell • Scientists think it had two brains • they have plates on their back
 Triceratops	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Herbivore • 3 horns to stab at enemies • Bony frill to protect its neck Triceratops means 'three horned face'
 Tyrannosaurus Rex	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Carnivore • Bite more powerful than a lion • Had a good sense of smell • Tyrannosaurus Rex means 'tyrant lizard'
 Velociraptor	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Carnivore • Had a feather covering • Second toe claw used to slash prey • Velociraptor mean 'quick plunderer'
 Pterodactyl	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Carnivore • It could fly long distances • They were flying reptiles not dinosaurs • They had hollow bones to make them light
 Plesiosaur	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Carnivore • They couldn't breathe under water so had to come to the surface for air • Plesiosaur means 'near lizard'

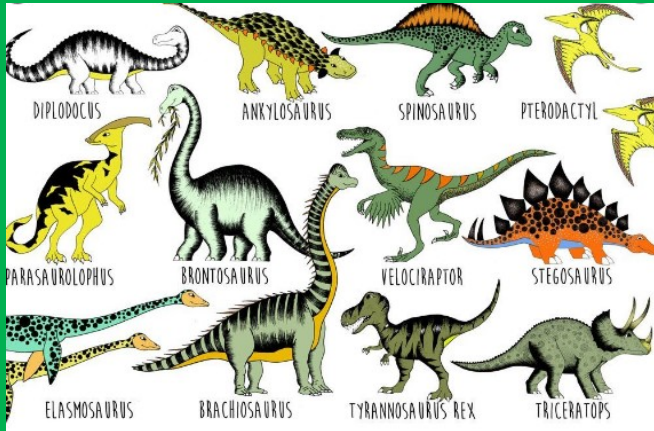
Herbivore	An animal that only eats plants, fruit and vegetables.
Omnivore	An animal that eats plants and meat.
Carnivore	An animal that only eats meat.
Extinction	When a complete group of animals dies out.
Meat	Food which is the flesh of an animal.
Plants	Something that grows from the ground.
Spring	A season after winter.
