



# Dinosaur ROAR




Glossary	
Term	Definition
Stegosaurus	<ul> <li>Herbivore</li> <li>Poor eye sight but good sense of smell</li> <li>Scientists think it had two brains</li> <li>They have plates on their back</li> </ul>
Triceratops	<ul> <li>Herbivore</li> <li>3 horns used when fighting</li> <li>Bony frill to protect its neck</li> <li>Triceratops means 'three horned face'</li> </ul>
Tyrannosaurus Rex	<ul> <li>Carnivore</li> <li>Bite more powerful than a lion</li> <li>Had a good sense of smell</li> <li>Tyrannosaurus Rex means 'tyrant lizard'</li> </ul>
Velociraptor	<ul> <li>Carnivore</li> <li>Had a feather covering</li> <li>Second toe claw used to slash prey</li> <li>Velociraptor means 'speedy thief'</li> </ul>
Pterodactyl	<ul> <li>Carnivore</li> <li>It could fly long distances</li> <li>They were flying reptiles not dinosaurs</li> <li>They had hollow bones to make them light</li> </ul>
Plesiosaur	<ul> <li>Carnivore</li> <li>They couldn't breathe under water so had to come to the surface for air</li> <li>Plesiosaur means 'near lizard'</li> </ul>












When did dinosaurs live? Dinosaurs lived around 66 million years ago.

Dinosaurs lived for around 160 million years (people have only been around for about 2.5 million years).




