What an interesting week it has been for Little Acorns! As we are learning the story, The Very Hungry Caterpillar, on Thursday we tried all the fruit the caterpillar ate and we voted for our favourite fruit! This week, we have focused on finding out about 'worms'. We learnt lots of facts about worms and the children have also learnt a rhyme linked to worms too – There's a Worm

at the Bottom of the Garden. A few children found worms in the soil and we took a closer look at them. Not only have we been joined by worms and snails, the caterpillars arrived on Tuesday and we also have some tadpoles in our classroom too! They have provided a great discussion point for the children. During phonics,

we have learnt the phonemes, 'i' and 'n'. I wonder if you can find any objects beginning with these sounds at home? We look forward to learning all about spiders next week!




Reception



Reception had an exciting delivery this week from someone called Jack. He left us some golden magic beans to try and grow different areas around our

environment.
Some children
planted their beans
outside, some in
the dark and some
inside. One of the
aroups who

planted their seeds inside had a bit of a surprise on Wednesday to find a beanstalk had grown in the classroom! They had some wonderful ideas about what could be at the top of the beanstalk, including a land full of sweets or horses you can ride forever. Some of the seeds we planted last week have also started to sprout, much to the children's delight, let's hope we can keep them growing until we harvest some vegetables from them...



Year One

Year 1 have thoroughly enjoyed the week. We have been continuing to look at multiplication and division and maths and have innovated the Hansel and Gretel text in English. In RE we began our learning on the creation story and we looked into lots of faiths beliefs. The highlight of the week though has been our world book day! We dressed up in fantastic costumes and all looked great. We continued setting descriptions and described Neverland - we even used some exciting similes. We also had a Wizard of Oz workshop, a special world book day celebration assembly and in the afternoon for Science we started our cress diaries and planted some cress seeds.

#### Year Two

Year 2 have had an amazing week this week. A highlight for the children and adults was dressing up for World Book Day! In English, Oak and Plane class read and explored the story of Peter Pan, before drawing and creating their very own Neverland island. They used their imagination to describe their dream island using a range of exciting vocabulary. In Geography this week, the children learned to identify the difference between human and physical features by going on a walk around the school grounds and looking for examples of features.

#### Year Three

Year 3 enjoyed learning about the Seder plate in R.E. this week. This is part of their wider unit on the links between religion and food. They had the opportunity to put together their own Seder plate with real food items and learned the significance of different items. For example, they learned that the salt water can represent the tears of those enslaved by the Egyptians.



#### Year Four

Year 4 progressed their understanding of decimals from tenths to hundredths. They learning was focused on fraction and decimal equivalents and correctly placing decimals on number lines. Year 4 really enjoyed constructing simple circuits in Science and have significantly improved their geographical knowledge through their new topic 'A Passport to Europe'.

#### Year Five

This week, year 5 have been looking at adding and subtracting numbers with different decimal places using the column method and showing these methods with different representations, as well as using them in word problems. The children have been doing a shared write, innovating around our model text and making changes. In Science, the children have been looking at the life-cycles or birds and butterflies, including having a look at our new butterfly net within our classroom and in History, we have been looking at evacuees and the reasons that children from cities

were evacuated to the countryside. In RE, we have been looking at how Muslims help their local communities, particularly during Zakat.

### News items from this week

#### Year One Vision Screening

Each year the Buckinghamshire NHS Trust (BHT) School Nursing Service routinely visit Reception Class to undertake vision screening and height and weight measurements. Unfortunately due to the COVID-19 pandemic, BHT were unable to undertake this screening last year. We are pleased to confirm that this will now resume for Year 1 children who are eligible and who have **not** had their eyes tested in the past 12 months.

On Tuesday, a letter was sent to all Year One parents/carers with regards to this and you are required to opt-out if you do not want your child to participate due to one of the following reasons;

- Your child is currently under the care of an ophthalmologist, orthoptist, optometrist at your local hospital eye clinic
- Your child is currently under the care of a local optometrist (optician) or had a recent sight test
- You do not want your child screened due to personal reasons.



#### Wellbeing Tips

One of the simplest, most-effective relaxation techniques for children (teens and adults too!) is mindful breathing. Teaching children to take slow, deep breaths helps to calm them physically and mentally. Here are 3 ways to make "Take a Deep Breath" more fun:

1. Blow out the candles. Hold up your hand. Inhale through the nose and hold for 3 counts. Exhale out the mouth to "blow out" (fold down) a finger!



- 2. Fog up the glass. Hold your hand in front of your face, palm inwards. Inhale through the nose, close your eyes and make a 'haaa' sound out your mouth, feeling the air against your palm.
- 3. **Inflate the balloon**. Place both hands onto your stomach. Feel it expand like a balloon, as you inhale through the nose. As you exhale, imagine the balloon deflating slowly.
