# What have we been learning this week?

## Little Ridges Nursery



This week we have been focusing on Autumn. The Berries have enjoyed lots of activities including making bird feeders, making tissue paper trees and spiced playdoh. Our song of the week has been dingle dangle scarecrow and the story was We're Going on a Leaf Hunt. The shape of the week was rectangle, the berries could find lots of rectangles in our classroom! Our words of the week have been stomp and sway which we have been practicing when doing our mindfulness activities for Mental Health week, they really enjoyed looking at the clouds pretending they were at the beach! They have also learnt Makaton for leaf. The cross country event was very successful, the Berries who took part used excellent listening ears and ran around the MUGA four times! Next week we are focusing on Winter and getting our plants ready to share in the community. Well done Berries for another fantastic week of learning and fun!

This week, Little Acorns have been learning some facts about spiders. We have also continued to learn our Talk4Writing story, The Very Hungry Caterpillar and we have noticed some changes in our caterpillars as they grow. The children have continued to look at the different bugs we have in our classroom closely, discussing the changes that they can see in them together. Next week, we are going to focus on snails and slugs. As it has been Mental Health Awareness week, Little Acorns have been discussing feelings and focusing on the Zones of Regulation. Outside, the children have sorted different pictures into the emotions and we have discussed why they may be feeling that way. One of our favourite activities this week was Cross Country on Wednesday! The children were amazing at persevering with running, even when they were tired, and they listened so well to all the adults. We are really proud of them for taking part!

## Reception

This week in Reception the children have been thinking all about what they would do with some magic beans. Quite a few of the children decided they would get as much chocolate as they could! In maths we have introduced books to the children and have been working on writing one numeral per square. As it is Mental Health Awareness week we have been

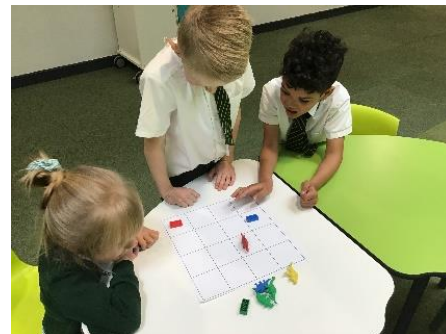


thinking all about what things make us feel happy and safe. We have spent some calming time outside enjoying nature and reflecting on how to look after our mental health. On Wednesday the children did a brilliant job during our cross-country event and tried their hardest to run as far as possible. All in all its been another fantastic week in Reception.

## Year One

Year 1 have had enjoyed their work this week. They have been working on their own innovated Hansel and Gretel texts this week and have been letting their imaginations run wild. In Maths we have been consolidating our knowledge on sharing equally and have been using lots of concrete resources to help us. We participated in our House Competition this week and thoroughly enjoyed taking part in the Cross Country event. In Science we continued to look after our cress plants and see how they have grown. This helped us to decide on the best conditions for plants growth. In Reading Skills we have looked into a non-fiction text all about sea creatures and we have learnt lots of fun facts linking to our Seaside topic!

## Year Two



This week, Year 2 began a new unit of learning in maths looking as position and direction. We started by revisiting some of the learning from year 1, such as

forwards, backwards, left and right, before introducing turns towards the end of the week. These include quarter turns, half turns, three quarter turns and full turns in both a clockwise and anti-clockwise direction. It was also lovely to hear the children beginning to make links to our current geography learning, where we have started to look at map skills and how to use a compass.

## Year Three

Year 3 enjoyed their cross-country house event this week. They had a course that took them around the perimeter of the field, through the playgrounds and round the back of the MUGA to join the field again. It was a long distance to run and the pupils demonstrated excellent resilience throughout with many completing it without stopping to have a break!

## Year Four



It has been a very fun and practical week for Year 4; the children have enjoyed the sun returning and had multiple opportunities for outdoor learning, including the house cross-country event and exploring decimal division by powers of ten using chalk on the playground. Year 4 have now

shared two lessons with their linking class at Brill School and enjoyed thinking about 'togetherness'.

## Year Five

This week, year 5 have been looking at adding and subtracting numbers with different decimal places using the column method, as well as multiplying and dividing decimals by 10, 100 and 1,000 and sequencing decimals. The children have been writing character descriptions, looking at how they can use show, don't tell to describe a character's personality and appearance. In Science, the children have been researching endangered animals and creating factfiles about them, and in History, we have been looking at rationing and the reasons for it. In RE, we were lucky enough to have Gareth Lane from the Church on Berryfields come in to talk to us about the different ways that Christians support our local community.

- What are you worried about when you lie in bed and can't sleep?
- Can you show me what you like about gaming?
- How do you feel about things changing?
- What do you think could help you to feel better?
- What have you enjoyed about today?

- Your child is currently under the care of an ophthalmologist, orthoptist, optometrist at your local hospital eye clinic
- Your child is currently under the care of a local optometrist (optician) or had a recent sight test
- You do **not** want your child screened due to personal reasons.
