## **Academy Uniform**

Which uniform should my child wear in September?

Either Winter or Summer uniform is acceptable until October half term. Winter uniform is worn from October half-term until Easter and summer uniform is worn from Easter until half-term in the autumn term.

## **Academy Uniform**

Please can you make sure your child's long hair is always tied back with hairbands which blend in with the colours of the academy uniform (green, grey, black or white). Children are kindly requested not to wear coloured bows or flowered hairbands.

We ask that any children who wear head coverings (e.g. a hijab) ensure this is plain black in colour.

Stud earrings and a watch is the only acceptable form of jewellery.

Please ensure that your child is not wearing: nail varnish, fake nails or make-up.

#### Non-uniform – but important

- In hot, sunny weather the children will need sun cream and a sun hat please make sure you have applied sun cream to your child in the morning before they come to school during these times
- Remember to name everything!



### Routines in Year Two

- Doors open at 8.40am, which is when learning commences. Early Morning Work is vital for embedding key skills each morning. Where possible, please ensure that your child does not miss this opportunity. Doors close at 8.55am when the register is taken.
- We expect that you leave the children at the door in the mornings and let them walk in by themselves, to encourage independence.
- If your child arrives at school after this time, please ensure that they sign in at the school office. They will not be allowed to enter via the external classroom door.
- Things for the office (e.g. payments) can be brought into school on any day but must be in a named envelope and immediately handed to the class teacher or adult or taken to the secure post box outside the main office.
- If your child is absent, please ring the office as soon as possible to let us know. Otherwise you will be contacted.
- Explanatory notes should be brought in by your child on their first day back at school and passed to the class teacher/adult who will ensure this is taken to the school office.
- If your child is ill in school and is not able to remain in class, a member of staff will be in contact. Please ensure emergency numbers and contact details are up to date.



#### Routines in Year Two

- At the end of the day the children will be dismissed from the classroom door at 15:15. Parents / carers must wait outside the classroom. Please be patient with us as we learn names and faces.
- When the member of staff in Y2 has seen a child's adult waiting in the line then they will be allowed to leave.
- If your child is not picked up by 15:25, they will taken to the office for collection there.
- Please be patient if you wish to speak to a member of staff at the end of the day as we must make sure all children leave the classroom safely. Alternatively, contact the office to make an appointment at another time
- Come and see us if there is a problem or question we are always happy to talk things through.



## What to bring

- Book bag (Reading record and reading book every day)
- PE Kit
- Water bottle
- Appropriate clothing for weather

Please do not let your child bring in toys or personal belongings unless we specifically ask!



## Behaviour Expectations

- We expect the highest standards of behaviour from the children at all times, irrespective of who they are with.
- We will have a whole-class reward system where we work collectively for a whole-class reward that has a learning focus e.g. an hour of an art project, or learning a new sport.
- We focus on the positives within the classroom, rather than the negatives, e.g. "Walk, thank you."
- We follow the whole-school behaviour policy.
- We teach children the correct behaviour for learning, e.g. being responsible, resilient, resourceful, reflective and how to reason.
- These learning behaviours / muscles are displayed in our classroom.
- The children are given dots (stickers) when they display the learning muscles that are essential to lifelong learning.
- Please ask your children why they have received the dot to encourage a positive dialogue around learning.


### Year Two Timetable


#### Presentation

- There is a focus on presentation across the school, particularly on layout and expectations of what the children produce.
- We are working hard to ensure that the quality of work done in school is reflected in the children's home learning as well, so please support us with this.
- Children in KS1 use pencil in both Maths and English.















## English

- Autumn term: Traditional Tales (Fairy tales), Recounts and poetry by Julia Donaldson
- Spring term: Tales of fear, Instructions and riddles.
- Summer term: Defeat the Monster tales, report writing and poetry by Sir Quentin Blake.
- All topics are based on a key text.
- English is taught following the Pie Corbett approach
- We will regularly listen to your child read individually during our Library sessions at least once a fortnight in the Autumn Term.
- Reading books will be handed in to be changed on a Wednesday and will go back out on a Friday. This may be revised as we go throughout the academic year.
- Children will be able to read and take books out of the library to bring home. They will be able to keep these books at home for two weeks. The children will visit the library weekly on a Wednesday or Thursday.



## English

#### Reading

- We expect all pupils from Reception to Year 6 to read daily for up to 20 minutes, to an adult, to younger children, or independently as the children develop into fluent readers. We would expect parents/carers to record daily reading in the child's reading record, which should be brought to school each day, as directed by the Class Teacher.
- There will be weekly Reading Skills sessions where the children will begin to learn reading skills such as deduction and sequencing.
- We would recommend the adult holds the following sorts of discussions post reading:
  - Can you summarise the story so far?
  - Why do you think that the author chose that word?
  - What effect does this sentence have on the reader?
  - Does this remind you of any other books you have read?
- Staff will initial children's reading record books once a week.
- Children's books will be changed once weekly, and will be in line with the phonics sounds they are learning that week in order to consolidate.

## English

#### Spelling

• Class Teachers will teach children spelling rules appropriate to their age group.

There will be a section in the weekly newsletter saying what has been covered that week and some suggested ways to practice/apply at home

#### How you can support at home

- Read daily with your children and ask them questions about their books
- Practise spellings when they begin to bring them home and apply them in sentences
- Promote strength in hand grip through activities such as manipulating playdough or cutting which will support pencil grip
- Encourage writing in different styles for example by keeping a diary or writing postcards



#### Maths

- Autumn term: Number: Place Value and Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication and Division and Measurement: Money.
- Spring term: Number: Multiplication and Division and fractions, Statistics and Geometry: Properties of Shape.
- Summer term: Measurement: Length and Height, Time, Mass, Capacity and Temperature, problem solving and Geometry: Position and Direction.

In Maths we follow a depth of learning approach which ensures that children securely understand specific concepts and they can apply this to abstract contexts and problem solving situations.

- Practise number bonds to 10 and 100.
