What have we been learning this week?

Little Ridges Nursery



This week in Little Berries we have been exploring our emotions and how we feel. Our song this week has been 'If You're Happy and You Know It' and 'You Choose' has been our story. The Berries have enjoyed a trip to the library and the dance studio this week and they have all been amazing at walking through the school!

The Little Berries word of the week has been unlock and lots of the Berries knew we could unlock a door.

Thank you for the wonderful videos of your children speaking in their own languages at home. They enjoyed sharing them with the class! Next week we are focusing on everything to do with maths. It's lovely to hear so many of the Berries are singing the feelings song at home. Have a wonderful weekend!





This week, Little Acorns have continued developing their listening skills during Phase 1 phonics. The children enjoyed tunina to different instruments and creating music with various instruments whilst listening to rhymes. It's been great to observe the children continue this throughout their play, exploring the different sounds

the instruments make. Throughout the week, we have learnt the song '5 Little Ducks' using different makaton actions.

Our number focus this week has been the number 2. The children are beginning to understand that when we have one and another one, we have two altogether! We have created a number 2 Numberblock and completed different challenges linked to the number 2 during continuous provision. Well done, Little Acorns!

Reception

This week started with our European Day of Languages! We have continued to greet the children every day in a different language. We have also finished our Talk 4 Writing story 'Owl Babies' and the children were so good and remembering the story through actions. The children were involved in creating some

of the actions. We have looked at the Owl Babies family, compared it with our own and discussed any similarities and differences. This week we have also starting Phonics! We have been learning some phonemes and we have been practising how to write them.



Year One

This week in Year One we have started looking at captions in English. The children have been learning to say what they see to help them develop their captions and then they have improved their work by adding adjectives to describe. We have been using adjectives all week in a lot of our learning and our favourite adjectives have been adorable, lonely and fluffy. In Maths, we have started to learn about ordinal numbers, looking at 1st, 2nd 3rd etc. The children have been putting them in order from first to tenth and matching representations as well. The children also started learning their songs for the Harvest Festival performance. They are very excited to put on a show for all of their parents! We have given each child a line to learn and it has been stuck in their reading record so that you can help them learn it at home. We can't wait for you to see it!

Year Two

We have had a wonderful week in Year 2! In English, the children have been completing their hot task! They have innovated the story of Little Red Riding Hood and created their own characters and villains. This will continue this over the next week as children are finishing their stories and editing what they have written! In maths, we have been learning to compare calculations using the relevant symbols and solving missing number problems. Continuing from this, we recapped our number bonds to 100 and worked with our learning partner to match the correct numbers together. On Friday we made finger pots in art which the children thoroughly enjoyed! This will lead to us making our own pots in the next few weeks.

Year Three

It has been another fantastic week in year 3. Firstly, would like to congratulate both classes for showing such great maturity during the lockdown practise on Thursday. The children were calm, sensible and silent and we were super impressed. Earlier on in the week, our in-school guitar teacher, Sam, treated the children and adults to a taster session, which they absolutely loved. Many children were left inspired and enthusiastic about learning the guitar. In addition to this, we had a zoom call to discuss arrangements for an exciting Christmas lantern project which we will be involved with in the coming weeks. To top the week off we had a virtual author visit where we heard from Dara McAnulty who introduced us to his new book 'Wild Child'. The children also finished writing their innovated guest tales this week and are ready to get cracking on the hot task on Monday, with some great ideas already flowing.

Year Four

This week some of our Year Four pupils completed their Level 1 Bikeability cycle training. We had a visit from Haddenham Cycle Training Centre who spent two hours training us to be safe on the road. We learnt all the cycle control skills needed and the children practised looking behind them and signalling the direction they were travelling in.



Year Five



This week in Maths, Y5 came to the end of our unit on place value. One of our final lessons in this unit of learning was on the use of negative numbers, whereby the children were set an investigation to find the difference between a range of negative numbers and positive numbers. Mrs Faisal and I were so impressed at how engaged the children

were, and at how well everyone worked together to complete the challenge!

Year Six

This week, Year 6 have been finishing off their persuasive texts about Camp Green Lake before looking at some example character descriptions for our new topic. In Maths, we have been looking at multiplying by 2-digit numbers, particularly thinking about what happens when we multiply by the multiple of 10, as well as looking at using short division methods to divide by 1-digit numbers. We finished off our experiment on the effects of exercise on heart rate, as well as investigating which countries were involved in World War 1. Many of the children had the chance to participate in Bikeability this week as well.

News items from this week

C3 B4 Me – What does this mean?



You may have heard your child come home and talk about one of the strategies we use at Green Ridge to develop their independence and resilience in learning.

One of our goals as educators is to encourage our pupils to become self-directed learners, and we need to shift our pupils' perception that the teacher is the source of all knowledge (this doesn't help for when they leave school eventually!) We want to create a sense of community among the learners in our classrooms. The C3 B4 Me approach shifts the roles of teacher and student and puts the student in the centre of the learning. Hopefully, this creates an environment that empowers and encourages pupils throughout their journey towards becoming more self-directed in their approach to learning.

For example, in class a teacher might say to the children that before they contact them for assistance, the children have to go to three sources to determine if they can find the answer to their question on their own. You could ask one of their classmates, check the sheet or TV screen for clues, check what is in their book, or use the iPads or laptops to help them find an answer. Or they might ask three of their classmates to see if they have the answer. We might then say to the children if they do not get the answer they need, then they should come to an adult. Most likely, at that point, it's a question we need to address with the whole class, and we'll determine the best way to share the information with everyone.

Ask your child what C3 B4 Me is, and how they use it in their classrooms – what three things or peers do they go to?




