A note from the Headteacher

One of the challenges so far this half-term has been managing the ever-changing landscape of COVID. You will have seen from my updated warn and inform letter this week, we have had a rise in the number of cases within school, and whilst this is still relatively small number in comparison with other local schools who have a great deal of cases, we rightly need to be cautious over the coming weeks. Cases have once again risen in Aylesbury as they have nationally, and we want to do what we can to help limit the spread whilst also trying to limit the need to move to any partial closures or remote education. It is our absolute last resort to have to make closures or move to remote education, and our advice from the Department for Education (DfE) is to consider other ways of limiting the spread initially for a few weeks before more stringent measures may be required. As such, I have asked all staff to wear face coverings in and around the school in communal areas and asked them to avoid unnecessary mixing of staff and pupils. In this way, I have made assemblies once again go back to being online, and staff are generally meeting remotely wherever they can with each other. We have also continued to re-iterate the importance of regular handwashing for staff and pupils. Our hope is that by acting now, this will help support lower numbers of cases within the coming weeks. However, what we do not want is to disrupt our children's learning, and so the DfE are clear that we do not put measures in place which would compromise this (such as staff not being able to work across multiple classes as often many do). Later in the newsletter I have some further updates and slight changes to our Harvest Festival and Pupil Learning Review arrangements – so please take a look and support us in allowing these events to take place as safely as we can.

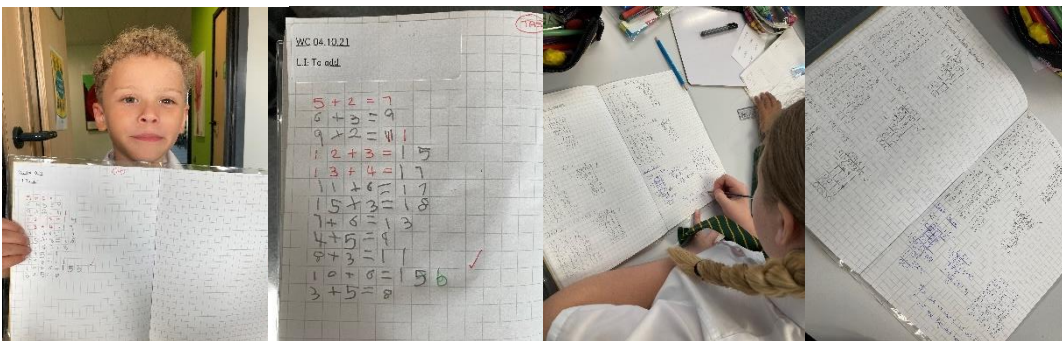

What have we been learning this week?

Little Ridges Nursery



We have had another wonderful week of learning and fun in Little Berries this week! Our focus has been Maths and the Little Berries have been exploring using different shapes to print, finding numbers in jelly and oats and building houses out of different shaped bricks. Our song of the week has been '1, 2, 3, 4, 5' which the children have learnt really well, and our word of the week has been suitcase which has prompted us to talk about what we might pack in a suitcase. The Berries have really enjoyed the story Pete the Cat with his four groovy buttons, and we used props to assist counting in sequence. Thank you for the uploads of pictures onto Tapestry. This week, we have been impressed with the children's engagement during our learning about Autumn. During play, the children have been weighing different autumnal objects and vegetables – it has been fantastic to hear the children using key vocabulary such as, 'heavy' and 'light'. Reception

Then we started our lead learner groups and talked about what we are good at and what we would like to improve. We have also started a new Talk 4 Writing story "We're Going on a Bear Hunt!" and have

been learning the actions. We have been continuing with our Phonics, learning new sounds and the children have been doing so well. Well done Reception, have a lovely weekend!

Year One



This week Year One put on their safety goggles and became scientists again! They used water, oil, food colouring and alka seltzer to make a lava lamp! They have been making brilliant predictions and have thoroughly enjoyed all of their experiments so far.

We have also been practising our Harvest songs and can't wait to welcome all of the parents to our performance next week. Every Year One child has a line in the show and these have been stuck into their reading records. Please make sure that you support your child at home to learn their line and practise saying it clearly. As a friendly reminder, Year One's PE days are Tuesday and Friday. We will not send PE kits home until half term and they shouldn't need washing before then. Please also ensure that everything is labelled with your child's name. Year Two

This week in Year 2 the children have been working so hard to demonstrate the value of resilience. In Maths, the children have been introduced to the calculation strategy of bridging 10, using a number line. We worked together to create actions for each step to success and had lots of practice with bead strings and number lines at our tables. In Science, the children have been enjoying learning all about materials and their properties. Following on from our materials hunt around the school last week, we started to look at the suitability of various everyday materials, for example; why is glass a suitable material for a window, etc? Also,

the children have loved their opportunity of exploring the importance of Black History Month and learning about our significant individual in Year 2; Oprah Winfrey. The children used information texts to find out more about her before creating their own fact files.

Year Three

The Year 3 team cannot believe how quickly time has flown by this term and we were thrilled to be able to go on the first trip of the year this week. We visited Chiltern Open Air Museum and were lucky enough to be able to take part in both a Stone Age and an Iron Age workshop. Miss Riley and Mr Brinn would like to thank everybody who attended the trip for representing Green Ridge with pride. As well as this, we have put in a huge amount of effort writing our English hot tasks, coming up with some fantastic ideas for quest tales, with ideas ranging from Princesses meeting Dragons to Queen's servants travelling by submarine to the depths of the ocean. In addition, we began the festivities by designing our very own Christmas cards ready for them to go on sale soon - is it too early for Xmas songs? Finally, we would like to thank all the children who are continuing to submit their home learning and completing this to a high standard - we are grateful for your effort and it does not go unnoticed! Year Four



This week Year 4 have been very busy earning lots of learning dots and learning about lots of different things. In Maths, we have been exploring Roman Numerals and Negative numbers. In Science we have been

Year Five

This week in Science, Year 5 continued to explore our solar system, by investigating the Earth's rotations and how we get night and day. We did this through the use of torches (the Sun), and the children recreated the Earth's rotations whilst orbiting. After this, we planned an investigation to track the sun's location at different points of the day.



Year Six

This week, Year 6 have been planning and writing together a character description for a new character who has found themselves at Camp Green Lake. In Maths, we have been looking at the steps needed to do long division, from using partitioning to assist with finding the multiples of an unfamiliar 2-digit number to following the steps through. We carried out an experiment looking at lung capacity as well as exploring some of the different ways that we, or those around us, might exhibit signs of poor mental health and how we can support ourselves or them. In History, we looked at the Western Front and where many battles from World War 1 took place.

News items from this week

One-Way System by Main Pupil Entrance

Based on some of the parent/carer feedback from the recent Parent Forum meeting and through informal feedback to Mr. Wanford at the start and end of the day, we have decided to trial the re-introduction of the one-way-up and one-way-down system by the main pupil entrance gate (by the side of Reception play area and by the Year One entrance). We recognise that this is a pinch point, particularly with a number of parents/carers wishing to access the rear of the school, and hopefully by sticking to the right on the way up and sticking to the right on the way back down, this will help ensure that parents/carers are not going 'against' the crowd in either direction.

We will be putting barriers back up before Monday to help visually support this, and we ask that you support us by ensuring that you walk on the right in both directions if you are entering via the main gate.

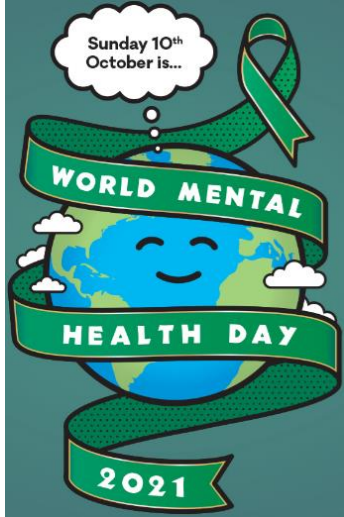
