### What have we been learning this week?

Little Ridges Nursery



What another wonderful week in Little Berries! This week's focus has been Mark making and practising our gross and fine motor skills. The berries have explored painting with different materials, watching what happens when you add water to paint and mix, making marks in playdough, making our own instruments and

potato printing. We have continued aspect 2 in phonics and the children have done incredibly well with the instrumental sounds. We have had trips to the library and dance studio. Our word of the week has been 'hidden' which the children have learnt by playing peepo! Next week we are recapping all the children's

favourite activities over the half term so if the children have mentioned any particular activities to you please let me know and we will re do them. Thank you for your support with the 'Let's learn together' challenge, we hope you have lots of fun with it. Please ask if you have any questions. Have a lovely weekend!





Little Acorns have focused on 'Rhythm and Rhyme' this week during Phase 1 phonics! thoroughly enioved taking part in 'Rhyming Silly Soup' and did well to have a identifying qo at some rhyming words. Durina continuous provision, children have been building obstacle courses and working together to do this. They have

also been building different models using various construction materials, developing their social skills by listening to their friends' ideas. Please take a look at the 'memos' section on Tapestry for the children's first challenge: 'Time to Talk Autumn Walk'. We look forward to seeing what you get up to on your Autumn Walks!

### Reception

We have had a very busy week this week in Reception. We have enjoyed continuing our 'Talk 4 Writing' story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' and creating actions for the different parts of the story. Then we came in looking our smartest for our very first school picture. We then had a very special treat; two police officers came in to speak to us about what they do and to read

us a story called 'PC Ben'. We have been enjoying our phonics lessons, learning new sounds, and starting to blend. This week, we will all be taking our reading books home and we are very excited for you to read them with your children. Our wonderful week has been topped off by an incredible cinema movie night, ran by the PTA. Have a lovely weekend!



#### Year One

This has been a very exciting week for Year One! They had their first ever school performance on Thursday when they performed in the Harvest Festival Assembly. They all said their lines so confidently and sang their hearts out. The whole Year One team is so proud of how hard the children worked to rehearse and put the performance together. Well done Beech and Elm! We also had some exciting visitors yesterday. We have been talking in PSHE about keeping ourselves safe and how and who to ask for help. We were visited by two police officers who talked to the children about how they can contract the police if they need help and what the police can help with. We even got to see inside their police car!

#### Year Two

In Year Two this week, we have been looking at poetry. This has involved the children looking at poems and spotting rhyming words and going on a nature walk around the school to get ideas for their own poem! In Maths we have looked at subtracting by bridging ten. This involved us finding the nearest ten, jumping to it, and then subtracting the remaining amount. In history, learnt about what fire safety equipment we have now, compared to when the Great Fire of London happened in 1666. We discussed whether we thought fire hooks and water squirts were effective in extinguishing fires and what we have now that is far more superior!

#### Year Three

Year 3 have been busy this week as usual. For home learning this week, the children reflected on the trip to Chiltern Open Air Museum and it was evident that all children absolutely loved their visit and remembered and learned so much. This was great to see! We are now working our way through the Stone Age timeline and this week we were focusing on a Neolithic settlement, Skara Brae, looking at the features which

make up the remarkably well-preserved site. As well as this, in English we have begun a two-week poetry unit on Limericks. At first, we were a little unsure on the rhyme scheme as it was unlike anything we had seen before, but now we have a good understanding of the toolkit features. Our Christmas lanterns have now all been decorated which is incredibly exciting and we cannot wait for them to go up at Waddesdon Manor-the children have designed them fantastically! Our computing Time Travel Projects on Scratch are now beginning to take shape and we are uncovering some technical geniuses within the year group! One more week of hard work Year 3, and then you can rest over half term. Keep up the good work!

Year Four

Today Year 4 took part in an Ancient Maya workshop run by 'One Day Creative'. During the workshop, we looked at a Maya timeline, explored the different people in the Maya society and the world in which they lived. We discovered the different Gods of the Ancient Maya and their origin story. We investigated the Maya system of counting - explored how the Maya had a sophisticated system of counting, which was transcribed to show dates, calendars and stock counts.

#### Year Five

This week in PSHE, Y5 have been exploring gender identity and stereotypes. This is something the children found really interesting, and we had some fantastic discussions around this. We explored 'presumptions', and job roles that are presumed to be done by particular genders. The children then produced some wonderful illustrations of males and females in a range of roles.



### Year Six

This week, Year 6 have been planning and writing their own character descriptions for a new character who has found themselves at Camp Green Lake. In Maths, we have been looking at factors, multiples, prime numbers, squared and cubed numbers as well as introducing the order of operations with BIDMAS. We

carried out an investigation looking at secret sugar found in many of the foods that we love and the effect that sugar can have on the body. In History, we looked at the impact that minorities had during World War 1, in particular focussing on the inspirational Walter Tull.

She is aiming to complete the challenge on her birthday in which she started on 4<sup>th</sup> October.

Hilda is proudly walking in memory of her late husband Stanley Duncombe who was diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease and sadly passed away in 2001.
