Term	Definition
Zoo	A place where some animals are kept for study, conservation or display to the public
Big Cat	Includes tigers, lions, jaguars and cheetahs What big cats do you know? How many legs have big cats got? What sound would they make?
Monkey	A monkey is a primate such as mandrill, and tamarin.
Reptile	A reptile is an animal with scaly skin and lives in different habitats. It includes snakes, lizards and crocodiles.
Zoo keeper	Someone who looks after animals in the zoo
Polar bear	A bear who lives mainly within the Artic Circle.

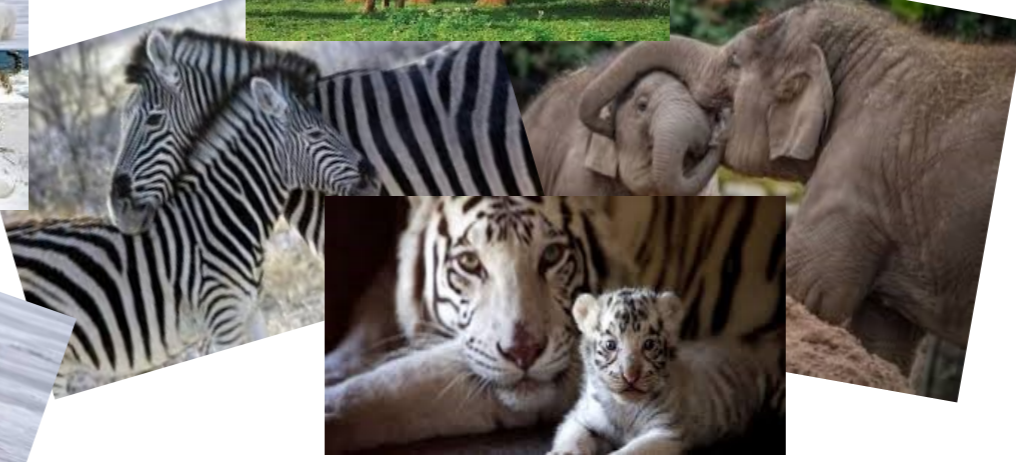
