# What have we been learning this week?

## Little Ridges Nursery



What a wonderful start to the new summer term! Our topic is the Great Outdoors. We have welcomed some new Berries into the class this week and what a fantastic start it's been, well done and thank you to the children and their families. The Little Berries have had fun in our florists, planted carrots and

learnt the song 'Down at the bottom of the garden!' Our Makaton sign has been 'Grow' and the word of the week has been 'touch'. We have explored lots of different things we can plant and grow and what they need to grow. Have a lovely bank holiday weekend!



It has been a great first week back completing lots of different activities for 'Wow Week'. Little Acorns have been introduced to their new topic 'Down at the Bottom of the Garden' and our minibeast focus has been a caterpillar and butterfly this week. We have been looking out for bugs in our outdoor area and we found

a ladybird! The children have also been creative, printing caterpillars using rolls and threading cheerios to make a caterpillar! The children have also created their own caterpillar number line.

This week, we started learning 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' for our Talk4Writing sessions and the children have remembered the Makaton actions really well. The children had an opportunity to try all the fruit that the caterpillar ate through in the story and they shared which fruit was their favourite – strawberry was the most popular!



Phase 2 phonics has started alongside phase 1 phonics and this week, we focused on the 's' and 'a' phoneme. I wonder if you can think of any objects beginning with these sounds at home?

## Reception

Reception have settled into their new routines extremely well. We are now completing a carousel of Literacy and Maths activities before the children choose their own learning in continuous provision. They have made us very proud with how well they have taken on these new challenges. In Literacy, they have been writing sentences about space, sequencing stories and drawing and labelling planets. In Maths, they have been counting objects to 20 and writing the numeral, ordering numbers to 20 as a team, writing in the missing numbers and exploring number games on the iPads. Reception have also loved exploring our new classroom environment now that we are learning about space and under the sea in our explorer's topic. They have created some extremely imaginative play with their peers which we have thoroughly enjoyed getting involved in. Well done, Reception! It is lovely to be back!

## Year One



Year 1 have had a very exciting week this week as both Elm and Beech got the chance to go Horse Riding at Hartwell Stables. This was a fantastic experience for the children and was part of our 11B411 experiences. The children had an amazing time grooming, mucking out and riding horses. They were so well behaved and

the stables staff were very impressed! We also celebrated our WOW day this week linked to our new unit on the Seaside, where the children created paper plate seaside scenes and learnt seaside songs in music. This week in English we began looking into our model text for our new unit of Warning Tales, titled Hansel and Gretel. The children enjoyed creating their own text maps to remember the key parts of the story and shared these with their talk partners. We hope you enjoy the bank holiday weekend, see you next week!



## Year Two

Year 2 have had a wonderful first week back, with the children settling back into their learning well. We began our new topic in English this week where we have been reading 'defeat the monster' tales. The children have really enjoyed this and created beautifully descriptive word banks about a river and stream that they will use in their writing. In maths this week, we have started our topic on position and

movement. The children have been fantastic in remembering their left and rights and directing their partners using the positional language we have been learning. All of the children got to enjoy our WOW Day! learning this Friday. The children spent the afternoon creating African Djembe drums in preparation for our geography learning this term. We hope the children enjoy the long bank holiday weekend!

### Year Three

Year 3 have settled back into the Summer Term brilliantly. The children have all come back focused and motivated after the Easter break and many of our learning dots have been given out already this week which is great to see. We began the week with our new English unit where we are reading and writing 'finding tales'. In maths we have been consolidating our knowledge of fractions and will be moving on to time next week. For our new science unit, we are exploring the question 'How does your garden grow?' as we move on to look at plants. In PSHE, we have started considering different family dynamics and recognising that families come in many different forms. Perhaps the most exciting part of the week was our WOW day this week as we were introduced to 'The Great British Road Trip', our topic for the term. We made some artistic collages of key British landmarks, researched British musicians and practised using a compass and developing map skills. Have a great bank holiday weekend!

### Year Four

Year 4 have settled back into routines well and have return to school with positive attitudes, ready to learn. We have started lots of different units including Power it Up in Science and a Passport to Europe in Geography. We have continued our decimal unit in maths and this week used concrete resources to explore place value. The class look at numbers consisting of tens, ones, tenths and hundredths. The children were using these to help them understand how the same digit can have a different value depending on its position on a place value chart and they used these resources to accurately write out the corresponding numbers.

### Year Five



This week in Design Technology, Year 5 began a new unit of learning, 'We Are Pinball Machine Designers'. We began by exploring what a pinball machine is, and the children were

tasked with researching when they were first invented, who they were invented by, what their purpose is and

how they have changed over time. Once they had conducted their research, the children worked in groups to present their findings to the rest of the class. Next week, we will begin to look further at how pinball machines are made, in readiness to begin designing our own.

### Year Six

Year Six have quickly settled back into their routines. In Maths, SPAG and Reading, the children have been developing their exam skills and consolidating previous learning with arithmetic, reasoning and problem-solving, spelling, punctuation and grammar knowledge, as well as V.I.P.E.R.S skills in reading skills. We have introduced our new topics in Science and Geography, looking at the age of the Earth as an introduction to our Evolution and Inheritance topic and looking at the location of Greece as part of our Gods and Mortals topic, looking at modern day Greece and Ancient Greece. It is clear that lots of the children have worked really hard on their revision booklets over the Easter holidays; they will really benefit from continuing to revise before our SATs start on 9th May.

# News items from this week

## REAch2 Parent and Carer Survey

Further to the letter sent on yesterday, over the next month REAch2 are asking all parents and carers across the REAch2 Academy Trust, that Green Ridge is a part of, to complete a survey.

The REAch2 Parent and Carers Survey is now live until **Sunday, 22<sup>nd</sup> May**, and we would really appreciate your views and opinions to help shape the future of REAch2 and Green Ridge. We are running this survey to help our school further improve teaching, learning and the daily experiences of every child. Data from all schools across REAch2 will also be used to help make improvements for children across the Trust. We will feed back on the survey results later in the year. ## School Expansion

Over the Easter holidays, 90 new Reception pupils were offered a space at Green Ridge for September 2022 (whereas normally it is 60!). From September, we will have our first 'bulge' class in Reception to meet the Local Authority demand for school places locally. Next year, we will have one spare classroom which our new Reception cohort can use, (in addition to our current two classrooms) but from September 2024, we will run out of rooms as the building stands.

The Local Authority has agreed to a building programme to begin the extension of the 'east wing' of the school with an additional eight classrooms and an additional toilet block, which will mean that should there be a need, we can continue to take 90 children in Reception each year, until we have three classes in every year group up to Year Six. This is exciting news for us as we continue to grow to be one of the largest schools within Aylesbury, but it will present us with

some logistical issues around the school as we begin building on the school site.

No confirmation has been given yet of when building may be likely to start, but it is anticipated that during the next academic year, building works will commence. More information will of course be given to you about this over the coming months when we have more definitive information.

We are in the process of adjusting our staffing for September to ensure we have enough staff for our additional class, as well as ordering furniture and resources.

## Partnership with FareShare – Fighting hunger, Tackling Food Waste



We are pleased to announce that starting on **Tuesday 2 May 2022**, we will be partnering with FareShare to distribute surplus food. Food will be available to collect from the front of the school from 8.30 a.m. every Tuesday (subject to food collection slots). We have decided to pilot the scheme for the summer term to see if it is successful.

### Q: Who is eligible to take food?

A: Anybody! Please do! This is food that would otherwise go to waste, so you are helping the environment by taking and using the surplus food.

### Q: Will the food be stored safely?

A: We will only be collecting ambient food – that is food that is safe to be stored at room temperature. A Food Safety certification has been completed and we are registered with Environmental Health.

### Q: Is there a cost/donation required?

A: No. It is completely free of charge.

### Q: Sounds great, how can I help?

A: We are very much in need of a rota of volunteers to help collect the food. Typically this would involve driving to Tesco Broadfields between 8.30-9.30 p.m. on a Monday evening, storing it overnight (in your car boot is fine) and then bringing it to school for 8.30 a.m. the next morning. There will be tables set up out the front by the main entrance. I am hoping we get enough volunteers that you may only be asked to do this once a term.
