Perform/ Performance	Present (a form of entertainment) to an audience.
Rehearse	Practice (a play, piece of music, or other work) for later public perfor-
Prop	A prop, formally known as (theatrical) property, is an object used on stage or screen by actors during a performance or screen production.
Role	An actor's part in a play, movie, etc
Create	Bring (something) into existence.
Pitch	The degree of highness or lowness of a tone.
Melody	A sequence of single notes that is musically satisfying.
Solo	Done by one person alone; unaccompanied.
Instrument	An object or device for producing musical sounds.
Rhythm	A strong, regular, repeated pattern of movement or sound.
Lyrics	Words that make up a song, usually consisting of verses and choruses.
Costume	A set of clothes in a style typical of a particular country or historical pe-
