Cultural Aspect

Germans first used the word 'Heimweh', which means the yearning for home in the heart of one who has been kept away too long. If we tried to directly translate into English it would become 'home-woe'. In the 17th century when German soldiers went to other countries it was noted that the young German men often suffered from 'heimweh' when undertaking foreign service, especially the mountain Swiss serving in the swamps of France or Italy. At a time when relatively few people ever got far enough from home to miss it, this "heimweh" seemed a genuine disease or abnormal physical condition.
