Which uniform should my child wear in September?

Either Winter or Summer uniform is acceptable until October half term. Winter uniform is worn from October half-term until Easter and summer uniform is worn from Easter until half-term in the autumn term. Please note the uniform is unisex.

#### PE Kit

Children will need their PE kit in school at the start of the term.

#### Hair

# How will transition happen this year? Stay and Play Sessions.

Our aim is to ensure children are as settled and ready for school as possible.

- We will be holding four stay and play sessions:
- Monday 12<sup>th</sup> June- Children new to Green Ridge only. <u>Either</u> 3.30pm-4.00pm <u>or</u> 4.15pm-4.45pm
  - For this session we welcome parent/carers to stay with their child for a short time, but to build the children's independence in readiness for September, we do ask that parents/carers leave the children for some time and return for the end of the session to collect them.
- Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> June- Children new to Green Ridge only. <u>Either</u> 3.30pm-4.00pm <u>or</u> 4.15pm-4.45pm
  - For this session, we ask that parents/carers remain on site again, but once the children are settled, we will ask you to leave the classroom to go and have a tea/coffee with our PTA in one of the other areas of the school. This will give your child an opportunity to spend some time alone with staff and other children. We will then invite parents/carers back to meet their child at the end of the session.
- You will already have been allocated a group for these sessions in the letter that was sent on 9th May. PRIMARY ACADEMY

# How will transition happen this year? Stay and Play Sessions.

Our aim is to ensure children are as settled and ready for school as possible.

- We will be holding four stay and play sessions:
- Wednesday 21st June- All children 3.30pm-4.30pm
  - For this session, to aid transition, we ask that all parents/carers leave the school site after they drop their child, and then return to collect them from the Reception gate at the end of the session.
- Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> June- All children 3.30pm-4.30pm
  - For this session, to aid transition, we ask that all parents/carers drop their child at the gate and leave the school site, and then return to collect them from the Reception gate at the end of the session. Having all the children in will enable them all to meet one another, and for us to make informed decisions about class arrangements for the transition morning the following week.

Please note that classes, teachers and house groups will be confirmed via email following this session but prior to the final transition morning.

# How will transition happen this year? Stay and Play Sessions.

- For all children there will be a final transition morning on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> July 9.30am-11.30am. At this session, your child will meet their new teacher, and the other children who will be in their class with them from September, either Birch, Hazel or Willow class.
- We will finalise classes and house groups following the fourth stay and play session- please look out for this communication as the transition morning will be in class groups.
- Please drop your child at the gate for this session (staff will be on hand to direct parents to the correct gate.)
- If your child is in Little Acorns a member of staff will take them to the correct class.
- Home visits will be offered to families new to Green Ridge- you will be able to sign up for via a link on the class letter you will receive during the week beginning the 26<sup>th</sup> June.
- Getting the children settled will be our absolute priority and we will be here to support you and your child through any worries.

### Other transition support.

- Tapestry- please ensure you have signed the consent form for this and returned to school.
- Tapestry- we will send an activation email, please activate your account and download the app to your phone. (if your child is currently in nursery at Green Ridge their account will just carry on into YR)
  - We will be using Tapestry as one of our transition tools this year.
  - We will use it to upload videos of the school, environment, staff and other things so please try to
    encourage your child to watch the videos so they can get to know us.
  - We would love to see some videos of the children at home uploaded so we can also get to know them.
  - The videos can be of anything; them talking, counting, looking at books, playing with family- they will all help us to get to know the children.
  - We will not be replying individually to anything uploaded so if there are specific questions please email the school on <a href="mailto:admin@greenridgeacademy.co.uk">admin@greenridgeacademy.co.uk</a>





### Over the Summer - The Road to School

- Let your child be involved (if possible) in buying the academy uniform. Practise dressing and undressing into and out of the uniform and PE Kits so they are comfortable doing this independently. (Do the same with shoes and wellie boots)
- If they still need help with toileting, please practise increasing their independence in this area.
- •If they use a dummy try to wean them off this.
- Share plenty of stories, foster a love of reading.
- Count steps, spoonfuls of food, cars anything that can be counted!
- Ensure your child is comfortable recognising their name.
- Work with your child so that they are comfortable holding a pencil correctly, e.g. focusing on mark making
- Develop their fine motor skills further: use of tweezers, scissors, playdough, cutting paper etc.
- Talk to your child about lunch times. If they are packed lunch, discuss what they would like and if they are having hot meals, have a look at the menus together.
- We focus highly on communication and language. It would be great if you could encourage your child to speak in full sentences and answer in full sentences.

### What to expect...

- We quickly work towards the children becoming independent. Settling them into school life will be our biggest priority in the first few weeks.
- We use Tapestry a huge amount to share the children's learning (wow moments) as well as messages (memos) and weekly activities. It is vital you get Tapestry set up and access it when observations are uploaded- if you need any help in getting this set up then please talk to us.
- We encourage them to be independent when choosing their lunch please talk to your child about the menu.
- Your child will probably be very tired the first few weeks and their behaviour at home might become more challenging.



### The Early Years Curriculum

We will be following the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum. There a big emphasis on ensuring that the foundations for further learning are developed.

#### Prime areas are:

- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Communication and Language; and
- Physical Development.

#### Specific areas are:

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the World; and
- Expressive Arts and Design.

Child Initiated Learning – where children are encouraged to learn through exploration and play. The timetable reflects this with a mix of adult directed and child initiated learning.

Learning will happen outdoors as well as in. Please ensure you child is prepared for any weather – hot or cold!

- Helicopter Stories/Story-time


Children will take part in adult-directed activities as part of their daily focused teaching, and adults will do this during CIL, so that it follows your child's interests.

Please ensure your child attends school punctually at the start of the day, and is collected promptly. This can be an anxious time for children!
