We kicked off this week with our Black History Month assembly on Monday where we spoke about the theme this year, 'Saluting our Sisters'. It gave a great opportunity to talk about what it might mean to be black and British, and share some examples of well-known authors like Malorie Blackman, and entertainers like Alesha Dixon and how their families and ancestors had been from outside of Britain but identified as British. I was really proud of how well some of our older pupils in assembly could understand the reasons why we mark such months and why it is important to continue to do so. Over the rest of the week, each of the classes has been following up on our assembly and looking at females as part of celebrating Black History Month, and if you've been following us on X this week, you will have seen some of the great learning about this.

Our Year Four pupils very much enjoyed their Mayan-themed workshop on Wednesday, and the immersive drama activities ensured the children learned a great deal about this period in history, whilst also having some good fun!

Online Safety Tip of the Week

<u>Managing Online Information</u>— EYFS/KS1

Explain that the internet can be a safe way to find information. We can use child-friendly search engines such as 'Kiddle' and these filter out anything that is not age appropriate.

Managing Online Information – KS2

Explain to your children the key differences between beliefs, opinions and facts. Unpick how all of these can be found online when conducting research and discuss ways to only find facts!

Right of the Week Article 38

Article 2 - No discrimination

Every child has rights. These should not be impacted based on their religion, race, appearance or any other protected characteristic. This is particularly relevant as this week the children all conducted an afternoon activity for Black History Month – celebrating a plethora of inspirational individuals.

Safeguarding Tip of the Week

Safeguarding Checklist for Clubs Outside of School

Even if the club is accredited, you should check that the organisation has:

- a named and contactable welfare officer responsible for the implementation of their safeguarding policy
- procedures for dealing with complaints or concerns regarding poor practice, abuse or neglect
- a code of conduct/behaviour charter
- a parental consent/emergency details form that you must return to the club
- safe recruitment procedures for those working with young people (inc DRS)
- access to appropriate safeguarding training for its staff/volunteers.


