Information on Measles/ MMR Vaccination

Measles cases are rising across the country, with over 102,00 children primary starting school in England being at risk of the catching disease. We are education asking settings to share key messages from



the NHS about MMR/Measles and how to get vaccinated.

Measles is highly infectious and if left unvaccinated nine out of ten children in a classroom can catch the disease if just one child is infectious. Please share these resources with colleagues, parents, and where suitable, community organisations to increase awareness and encourage parents to get their children vaccinated.

Talk to your child(ren) ways that the internet can unknowingly 'lure us into information'. Key strategies used are popups and targeted ads.
