Online Safety Tip of the Week

<u>Do you think about what you're sharing?</u>

We tell children to be careful about the pictures they share online, such as in their school uniforms, but at the start of every school year, many parents do this. It can be confusing for your child, but also an opportunity to discuss how you are doing this safely, e.g. privacy settings.

Modelling good behaviour includes asking their permission first and not oversharing. You could show them the image you want to share; assure them you are only sharing with family and that you have privacy settings in place. If they say they don't want their image shared, we should respect their feelings.

Right of the Week Article 12

Respect for children's views #12 Every child has the right to express their views, feelings and wishes in all matters affecting them, and to have their views considered and taken seriously.

This right applies at all times, for example during immigration proceedings, housing decisions or the child's day-to-day home life.



Sustainability Tip of the Week

Eco-Friendly Lunchbox Tips: Reduce Single-Use Plastic Waste!

Safeguarding Tip of the Week

Rewards and Discipline

- ✓ Praise children whenever possible for all they do.
- ✓ Reward positive behaviour and consider asking what would be a good reward.
- ✓ Avoid making rash decisions when you're angry.
- ✓ Talk to your child about the rewards and consequences of their behaviour and do it before rather than after.
- ✓Take time to really listen to what your children are saying and explain to them what you are feeling.
- ✓Be a role model and don't do things that you wouldn't want your children to do.
