Packed Lunches

For those children bringing in a packed lunch, please ensure that they are provided in an appropriate sealed container that is clearly named. These will be sorted on our lunchbox trolleys. We encourage you to provide a healthy, balanced lunch in support of our healthy eating policy and no fizzy drinks, glass bottles, confectionary or sweets are to be provided. We are a nut-free school therefore children must not bring in any food containing nuts, regardless of their nutritional value. Please check cereal bars and other similar products as they often have traces of nuts, which are also not permitted.

Parent Forum Reps 2023/2024

We are now looking again to re-establish a Parent Forum group for this academic year. To keep the group a manageable size, it will typically be made up of one rep for each class. Parent Forum meetings will be held each half-term. The first meeting for this half-term will be on: **Thursday**, 5th **October** at **2.15pm**. Meetings will alternate between just after drop-off or just before pick-up to avoid unnecessary trips to school.

We will communicate with all those parents/carers who express an interest to confirm whether they will be participating in the forum by Monday, 25th September.

Lockdown practice

The safety and welfare of our pupils and staff are our highest priority at Green Ridge. We practice safety drills throughout the year to help our children know what to do in an emergency. We have already conducted fire evacuations which were very successful, and children now understand what to do if they hear an alarm and how to exit the building quickly and safely.

Next week, we will be conducting a lockdown drill. A 'lockdown' procedure may be activated in response to any number of situations at the academy, but some of the more typical might be:

- A reported incident / civil disturbance in the local community (with the potential to pose a risk to staff and children in the academy)
- An intruder on the school site (with the potential to pose a risk to staff and children)
- A warning being received regarding a risk locally, of air pollution (smoke plume, Gas cloud etc.)
- A major fire in the vicinity of the school

The goals of the drills are to improve our ability to protect children, save lives, and reduce injuries. These practice drills allow us to evaluate our emergency operation plans and improve our response skills. Whilst we would not ordinarily notify you about such drills, as this is the first one your child may have experienced at Green Ridge, we wanted you to be aware. You would only be notified if there were a real emergency. The academy will conduct at least one lockdown drill each term. In this type of drill, we will secure the school building and safely shelter all children, staff, and visitors inside the building. The purpose of this drill is to keep the children safe from any danger outside or inside the building. During a lockdown drill, all perimeter doors to the school building will be locked and will remain locked until the danger or issue outside or inside the building is removed. To enable everyone to remain safe during the practice, no one will be allowed to enter the building or leave the building – including parents, carers or members of public.

Have a conversation with your child about what is and isn't acceptable to put online. You could complete a sorting activity with picture prompts and talk to them about 'permission'.


Online Reputations – KS2

Building a Positive Relationship

- Show your child you're interested in what they like. Think of enjoyable activities you can do together.
- Think of times when you have seen a positive change in your child's behaviour and anything you could learn from that experience.
- Ask your child for their views and be willing to listen. This can help you to see things from their perspective.
- Don't give up or be too hard on yourself if things don't immediately change. Focus on small steps and achievable goals.
- Be prepared to compromise and admit you've been wrong, and sometimes make mistakes yourself.
