Welcoming your feedback

We are aware as a large school that sometimes there are bits of feedback you want to give but are not always sure who is the right person to share this with. Whilst members of staff are always on the gates and outside each morning and afternoon, we recognise that not all parents and carers are able to 'catch' one of us if needed. Therefore, we have a range of ways that you can give us feedback, including:

- Approaching a member of staff on-site at the start/end of the day
- E-mailing admin@greenridgeacademy.co.uk so that it can be passed to the relevant person/team
- Passing your feedback to your parent forum rep in your class or year-group, who meets with Mr. Wanford on a half-termly basis to pass this feedback directly.
- Dropping in a written note for the school, and putting this in the grey, metal 'feedback'

- box in the main foyer (to the right as you come into the school)
- Completing our online form here, which is reviewed by leaders not less than halftermly, which is then shared as part of the parent forum group.

Feedback in this sense is something which you think we could be better at, tweak for next time or consider a different approach. For this reason, it is not something that needs to be dealt with urgently, and as such the above methods of giving feedback to not rely on an instant response.

We will always share our feedback in our Parent Forum group, in whatever way the feedback is shared, and our response to this. Understandably, not all feedback is able to be taken on-board due to constraints with the building/site/curriculum, but wherever possible we will aim to explain why we can or cannot act upon the feedback given.

We ask parents/carers to be mindful of the 'Who to Contact' guide shared with you previously, which gives clear guidance of specific staff to approach for specific questions and issues which need a swift resolution.

Have a conversation with your child regarding their online activity. How can they show kindness and respect? What does good behaviour look like online? How can it impact others if we do not use kind words online?


Cyberbullying - KS2

Right of the Week Article 38

Article 28 – Access to Education

Every child has the right to an education – this should be free for primary school age children. Within an educational setting, behaviour management should respect children's rights and not use any form of violence.



Every child has the right to an education. Primary education should be free. Secondary and higher education should be available to every child. Children should be encouraged to go to school to the highest level possible. Discipline in schools should respect children's rights and never use violence.

Sustainability Tip of the Week

Recycling at Home

Turn recycling into a fun detective game! Teach your children to read packaging labels. Help them identify symbols that indicate whether an item is recyclable. This not only educates them but also sharpens their observation skills.



Safeguarding Tip of the Week

Children Staying Home Alone

There's no legal age limit for a child to stay home alone, but it's against the law to leave a child alone if it puts them at risk. Things for you to consider:

- A baby or young child should never be left alone, not even for a few minutes — whether they're asleep or awake.
- Consider whether the environment an older child is left in is safe and their basic needs can be met independently.
- Make sure they have your number and know who/how to contact you in an emergency.
- Talk through the "what if" scenarios with your child.
