Thank you to everyone who has helped us to rescue food this term. Since we started

distributing food back in May 2022, we have saved more than 5 tons of food!

You may have noticed that we have moved our food tables to just outside the school office where it's not guite so busy! Please do remember to pop by on the school run and take any food you can use.

We are pleased to announce that we are trialling an additional collection each week from Sainsbury's. Our current food distribution schedule looks like this:

We would also like to remind you that children should not be taking any food or bringing it into the classrooms, and that food should only be taken by adults. Additionally, we are delighted to see that the

KFC is particularly popular! We do ask that to reach as many people as possible, each family only takes one bag.

Our FareShare project runs entirely on the goodwill of a team of friendly volunteers. We would love to be able to expand that team and meet some new parents. Most jobs only take five minutes and can be done alongside the school run – and the children love to help too!

How can you help?

Online Safety Tip of the Week

Self-image and Identity - EYFS/KS1

Ask your child what could take them out of the 'green zone' when using digital devices and discuss the importance of saying: "No." or "Stop." when something is doing something they dislike.

Speak to your child about 'online identities'. Unpick how anyone can make an online profile and people may not always be trustworthy – people are not always who they say they are. What should we do if something makes us feel unsure?

Sustainability Tip of the Week

Christmas Trees

Forestry England have some great tips on making sure your Christmas tree is as sustainable as can be. They include, if you choose a real tree, making sure it is Grownin-Britain certified, opting for a potted tree (which can last a lifetime, not just

Christmas!), and recycling your tree after you've used it. If you're opting for a fake tree, it's estimated to take 10 years to make it environmentally worthwhile, so make sure you love it.

Safeguarding Tip of the Week
