Sadly, I missed the start of the week at Green Ridge this week, as like many of our children and staff, I managed to catch whatever unpleasant cold/flu/virus that seems to be impacting so many of us in different ways. One thing that seems to be common for many of those who have been unable to come into school is the high temperature and fever, and the general fatigue that seems to persist throughout. If your child does have a high temperature of 37.4 or above, then please do keep them off school until their temperature has come down without any medication for a 24-hour period and they are well enough to return. Whilst we want our children to enjoy every bit of school and attend for every day possible, if a child really is that unwell, then the safest and most comfortable thing for them is to be at home, resting and being carefully monitored. My sincere hope is that over the next few weeks as we move into February and towards spring, the worst of this virus that is circulating comes to an end, and we can hope for a healthier rest of the academic year!

I apologise if there has been some disruption to your child's class teaching arrangements this week, but there simply hasn't been the availability of other internal staff or supply staff to meet the demands of absence – not just at Green Ridge but in all other schools with similar absence levels. We have tried wherever possible to ensure that we've kept disruption to a minimal, whilst also trying to balance all other events and meetings etc. taking place.

KS2 Snacks

We would like to remind parents/carers that chocolate, crisps and sweets are **not** permitted if you are providing your child in KS2 with a morning snack. Should your child bring in a snack which we believe is not adequate, we will have no choice but to take the item/s off them and return them to you at the end of the day. We would also like to take the opportunity to remind you that we are a **nut-free school** and children should not be sharing snacks due to allergies. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

Children in Key Stage 2 are encouraged to bring a small snack of fruit (either a piece of fruit or packet of dried fruit, such as raisins), vegetable or cheese to eat at break time. Cereal bars are not permitted.

Online Safety Tip of the Week

KS1 – Online Reputation

Speak to your child(ren) about their digital footprint - everything that is posted online can be found so we need to be very careful what we do online

Children do not always know if what they are going to post online is suitable. Ask them to name at least three people they can speak to, for guidance, before they post something.

Right of the Week Article 2

Article 2 - No Discrimination

This article ties in perfectly with our school values, namely kindness, respect and friendship. Ask you child if they can name any 'protected characteristics' and explain the importance of showing respect to everyone and celebrating each other's differences.

Talking about Grief

Children can usually understand that death is irreversible and universal. They will ask frequent questions about death and it is very important that they are supported through their understanding of this using age appropriate language.

Things to include:

- Let them talk about how they feel and just listen. Validate that it is okay to have these feelings.
- Use simple, age appropriate language to explain what has happened to support closure.
- Inform school if your child is struggling with grief and we can support and signpost resources.
