Online Safety Tip of the Week

KS1 – Managing Online Information

Ask your child to search for something online. Which search engine do they naturally use? Are there any filters that are in place to prevent inappropriate content surfacing?

KS2 – Managing Online Information

Ask your child to explain what a search engine is and – if they can – how they work. Can they describe the benefits of using Kiddle over Google, for example?

Right of the Week Articles 37 & 40

Children in Detention

Children who are accused of breaking the law should not be killed, tortured, treated cruelly, or put in prison forever, or put in prison with

Children accused of breaking the law have the right to legal help and fair treatment. There should be lots of solutions to help




these children become good members of their communities. Prison should only be the last chance.
