### Sun Cream and Sun Hats

With the warmer weather now upon us and temperatures set to rise, we kindly ask that parents and carers apply sun cream to their child before they come to school. If your child is likely to need additional sun cream during the day, please send this in with them, clearly labelled with their name, and hand it to their class teacher so it can be applied as needed (typically before break and/or lunchtime).

We also recommend that children bring a sunhat to school. Green Ridge hats are available from Bucks Schoolwear Plus, although children are welcome to bring their own baseball-style hat if they prefer. A number of children have also been bringing sunglasses; these may be worn outside, but they remain the responsibility of the child rather than the school.

As always, please ensure all items are clearly labelled so that, if misplaced (as often happens), they can be easily returned to their owner.
